National Literary Award Granted Fr. David Gannon Parish To Bid Farewell To Father Thomas Florack

The Very Rev. Angelus Delahunt, S.A. Superior General of the Franciscan Friars of the Atoneement at Graymoor, has announced that Father David Gannon, S.A. author of the recently published biography of Father Paul of Graymoor has been granted Honorary Membership in the International Mark Twain Society.

The Honorary Membership, which includes the International Life Membership of the Society is not available to the general public but is conferred upon those entitled to recognition in the various fields of endeavor. When awarded an author as in the case of Father Gannon it is conferred in public recognition of his contribution to literature.

DISTINGUISHED membership of the Society includes: His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, Chaplain, the Hon. Winston Churchill, English representative since 1937, Herbert Hoover Honorary Vice-President, the

Prize Winner, Andre Maurois, biographer, and Madame Chiang Kai-Shek, Chinese Representative of the Mark Twain Society.

Father Gannon, author of this full-length portrait of Father Paul of Graymoor, was born in New York City on Sept. 16, 1904. Ordained to the priesthood at the Catholic University of America in 1930, Father Gannon at his own request was assigned to missionary work among the Negroes at Kingston, North Carolina. This was in 1940, and he carried on this work for eight years until his health gave way and he returned to Graymoor. It was during this period of convalescence that Father Gannon undertook the interesting task of compiling the data for a biography of Father Paul.

Father Gannon has a fine sense of humor and his account of the ingenious devices that had to be used in order that Father Paul might keep his private vow of never touching money, is said enjoyable and amusing.

Strike Looms For Insurance Agents

A nationwide strike involving more than 15,000 insurance agents employed in 25 states and the District of Columbia by the Prudential Insurance Company on December 1st is a certainty, today, as "extra" negotiations between the company and the Insurance Agents' International Union (A.I.U.) continued to be stymied over the matter of compensation.

More than 750 Prudential agents employed in Rochester would be affected by such a work stoppage. It was announced at strike headquarters, 36 State St.

Talks between the Company and the Union opened October 1st and were called off by the Union on October 19. The United States Mediation and Conciliation Service intervened and negotiations were resumed in New York on November 13th with Commissioner Thomas G. Dougherty presiding.
