It is reliably known that three of the nuns have comtracted tuberculous while in pelson and the two others are suffering from a heart condition, This news was beought out by a communist nurse who was sent to examine the nuns when they reported themselves unable any longer to live on their diet of rice alone.

The condemnation of defenseless women who were not afforded an opportunity to defend themselves at the "trial" points up the general position of Christian missionaries in China. Twenty-two Catholic Blahops and 300 Chinese and foreign priests and Sisters are languishing in communist jails today in the regime's effort to obliterate Christian influence in a political community that comprises almost one quarter of the human race.
