### Postmaster Spurs Early Mailing

Postmaster Donald A. Dalley said today, "Postal employees will be enjoying their last peaceful weekend before wading into the annual deluge of Christmas mail."

"In another week we'll be swamped. I only hope that the people here in town realize how much they can help us, and themselves, by mailing their Christmas cards and other gifts during the next few days.

To underscore the importance of this situation, the Postmaster noted that during normal periods post office cancellations average 200,000 pieces of mail per day. Cancellations are now running about 240,000 per day, and at the peak of the Yuletide season they will average 1,450,000 per day.

Anticipating this increase, the post office goes on its holiday schedule beginning today, Dec. 7. Service windows, Main Post Office only, will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Sunday, Dec. 9, 12 noon to 8 p.m., for sale of stamps and acceptance of parcel post packages.

Christmas greeting cards and packages for out-of-state delivery should be posted by Dec. 11. Those for local delivery at least a week before Christmas Day.

Post office windows are most crowded at lunch time, so Postmaster Dalley advises that packages be mailed before 10 a.m. or between 1:30 and 3:30 p.m. "The lines will be shorter then, and it's easier on the feet," he added.
