

**Needed Equipment Presented
Mercy Hospital In Auburn**

Auburn—Mercy Hospital was recently the recipient of a valuable donation in the nature of additional diagnostic equipment, made possible by the Cayuga Health Association.

THE GIFT, financed by funds raised through the purchase of Christmas seals, was a sphygmometer, an instrument used to measure the vital capacity of the lungs and a valuable device in determining the condition of persons under examination for rheumatic fever or heart disease.

Auburn City Hospital was also presented with the same equipment.

These gifts to the two local hospitals fall within the scope of the Association's new and expanding program, which utilizes the Christmas Seal funds not only for tuberculosis but for combating rheumatic fever and heart disease as well.
