He commented: "Many of us have felt for a long time that although schools devote time to basic skills and fundamentals, every educational system is going astray from its purpose if it does not help children to answer that most important question: What is the Good life?"

> THE SUPERINTENDENT said he believes "any school system falling short of its purpose if does not help answer that question. For this reason, Kirlin added, he "welcomed" the action of the Regents and asked endorsement by the Board.

He commented later that the Regents "for many years leaned over backward to carry out the literal meaning of the separation of Church and State." They have become "increasingly concerned with sweeping over America of a purely materialistic point of


