The young soldier of 118 Columbia Ave. died in action in Korea on August 12, 1950. Solemn High Mass was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph S. Cameron, assisted by the Rev. George S. Wood as deacon and the Rev. Edward Zimmer, subdeacon.

Monroe County American Legion Honor Guard, Gold Star Mothers and Boy Scouts of Immaculate Conception Church were represented.

Bearers were William McDonald, John McDonald, John Holford, Milton Windhauser, Joseph Vaeth and Harold Stundner. Burial was in Arlington National Cemetery, Washington, D. C., on Friday.

He is survived by his father, Francis J. Swift; his mother, Mrs. Theodore R. Carson; one brother, Edward R. Swift; one sister, Mary Louise; his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Gordon T. Graham; several aunts and uncles.
