Funds For 30,000 Meals Asked By Hospice Group

Christmas dinner will come two days early this year for the more than 100 men who receive free meals daily at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave.

Because many of these men obtain their meal on the holiday itself through various charities, the Hospitality House will shift its "Christmas dinner" for them to 2 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 23.

FUNDS FOR this and the 30,000 meals served throughout the year come in great part from the annual Christmas appeal mailed this week to hundreds of friends of the South Avenue institution by the Rev. George C. Vogt, House chaplain.

Work of the House, now in its eleventh year, is generously supported by many priests, organizations and individuals who respond to the appeal, Father Vogt said. Approximately \$5,000 is expended yearly in the work of dispensing food and clothing and in operating the House, the priest noted.

CONTENT of the daily meals depends on the amount of funds and the varying amount of food donations. Despite contributions of food by grocers, markets, bakeries, wholesalers and area processing plants, it is necessary to supplement the meals through direct purchase of food. Thousands of articles of cloth-

ing, donated throughout the year to the House, also are dispensed to the men who come daily, and to needy families. The House operates a truck for clothing collection, which may be obtained by calling EMpire 1086.
