### Red Cross Changes Respiration Method

The American National Red Cross has announced that the back pressure-arm lift method of artificial respiration has been adopted in preference to the prone pressure method which has been standard in this country for over thirty years.

The revolutionary change came about as a result of extensive research sponsored by the Armed Forces, the Red Cross and the American Medical Association in an effort to find a better method of manual resuscitation.

Experiments performed on animals and anesthetized persons revealed that several methods of artificial respiration ventilated the lungs more efficiently than prone pressure.

The back pressure-arm lift method was found to be best suited to general use, because it not only provides a better exchange of air but is easy to learn and apply.
