### St. Mary's Hospital Affiliates With Georgetown University Medical School

the development of its medical education program, Rochester's St. Mary's Hospital has established affiliation with Georgetown University Medical School in Washington, D. C., and engaged a fulltime medical educator to direct its expanded medical education services.

Announcements of these farreaching steps were made today by Dr. Leo F. LaPalm, St. Mary's chief-of-staff who explained the importance of the new moves as

1. THROUGH affiliation with Georgetown University Medical School, the teaching facilities of St. Mary's Hospital will be augmented to provide improved training for internes and resident physicians.

2. The newest results of modern medical school research will be brought directly to the bedside of patients at St. Mary's through extended visits each month of doctors holding professorship rank at George awa Medical School.

During their monthly visits to St. Mary's Hospital, the Georgetown medical educators will make rounds to patients with attending physicians of St. Mary's, and also conduct seminars and roundtable discussions. Not only attending physicians but all staff physicians will be included in the roundtable discussions, according to Dr. LaPalm who sees in this phase of the program an oppor-tunity of stimulation for the whole staff.

3. Under the affiliation agreement, internes at St. Mary's will be rotated for periods of special training at the Georgetown Medi-

4. FIRST YEAR resident physicians will be provided a year in basic medical science at Georgetown, after which they will return to St. Mary s for two years of clinical work.

5 The agreement between the university and the hospital also provides that two St. Mary's staff doctors at one time may go to the Georgetown Medical Center for a week of special training.

To implement its expanded program St. Mary's has engaged Dr. John Butler of Worcester, Ohio, as Director of Medical Education. Formerly attached to the Emory Medical school, Dr. Butler's role at St. Mary's will be to coordinate various phases of the new educational services and to work in close conjunction with the St. Mary's Staff in preparing material for consideration of the visiting staff members of (reorgetown.

Dr Butter recently has spent considerable time at Georgetown in preparing plans for the St Mary's program which will be aclivated early in 1952 according to Dr LaPalm
