## 141 Missioners In Red China Jails

Hong Kong -(NC)- The names of 141 foreign Catholic missionaries jailed in Red China have been released by responsible Church officials here.

The list includes the names of 18 Bishops and Archbishops, four of them American. In addition to the four Bishops, ten other American missionaries are listed.

The list carries the name of one Canadian-born Bishop and 14 other Canadian missionaries. It also includes 22 Italians, 26 Ger mans, 41 French missionaries, 12 Belgians, three Dutch priests, two Irish priests, five Spaniards and one Polish nun.
