Free Will "nobody goes to Hell unless he himself chooses", "I am that evil and suffering on earth are mysteries we do not fully understand," and "I think there are moral principles justifying war under certain conditions, there is a moral right of defense," and that "thank God America never has been guilty of an aggressive war." Queried about the Christopher movement, the founder said there are "no members, meetings or dues." It seeks to reach average people, he continued, "urging personal responsibility and appealing to the best in every person," and encourages them to "help change the world back to love of God and neighbor" by exerting their influence especially in the fields of education, government, communications and labor relations. Financed by donations "from big and little people of all faiths," Father Keller said, the movement has a million and a half books in circulation, and distributes its literature free to any persons requesting it.
