

Trappist Life Broadcast Set At Monastery

The rigorous routine and purpose of Trappist life will be explained to diocesan listeners in a special broadcast from the new Trappist Monastery of Our Lady of the Genesee near Pittsford next Sunday, Jan. 20 at 12:10 noon on WHAM as a feature of the **COURIER JOURNAL'S** weekly radio program produced by the Rev. Richard Tormey.

Believed to be the first such program of the "insider's viewpoint" ever aired from the silence of a Trappist monastery, the broadcast will feature an interview with Father Girard McGinley, O.C.S.O., superior of the new community. Father Tormey will draw a word picture of their property and daily schedule.

THE TRAPPIST group numbers 33 choir monks and brothers who came into the Genesee Valley from the mother monastery at Gettysburg, Kentucky last April.

Occupying a fertile 1,400-acre farm a few miles northwest of Genesee, they have established a temporary monastery in an old farmhouse and started to erect a brick guest house and quonset buildings for permanent monastic use.

Scheduled for Fall or next Spring is a large stone building, an abbey overlooking the picturesque Genesee country.

Scores of friends from the rural neighborhood and from Rochester have assisted the monks with gifts of money, livestock, chickens, equipment and weekend labor. The broadcast will include Father Girard's appreciation of these gifts and his announcement of future plans and needs of the group.

Outstanding items of the daily routine of the monks will be discussed on the program, as will the prayer, silence, labor and mortification which distinguishes the Trappists.

New ROTC Head At Niagara U. Is Korea Veteran

Lt. Col. Samuel G. Kail, Inf., a veteran of World War 2 and the Korean conflict, has been named commandant of the Reserve Officers Training Corps unit at Niagara University, according to the Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., university president.

Colonel Kail, who will take over his new duties immediately, succeeds Lt. Col. John H. McKinnon, who has held the post since the retirement of Colonel Edwin Swanton last September.

Upon graduation from West Point in 1939, Colonel Kail was assigned to Fort Huachuca, Arizona, where he served with the 25th Infantry Regiment. He remained in that post until 1942 when he was transferred to the War Department Intelligence Bureau in Washington, D.C.

FROM 1941 until 1946 Colonel Kail was an intelligence officer with the 13th Airborne Division in Europe and at Camp MacKall, N.C., and later served in the same capacity with the 82nd Airborne Division until May 1946. From July of 1946 until January 1949, Colonel Kail was an Intelligence Officer with the U. S. Army Forces in the Antilles.

Colonel Kail was named Battalion Commander of the 7th Infantry Division at Fort Devens, Mass., in the early part of 1949, working with that group to the Korean battle lines in August 1950. He was rotated from Korea in October of last year, arriving in San Francisco on Nov. 26.


For his distinguished exploits in World War 2 and the Korean War, Colonel Kail has been awarded the Combat Infantry Badge, the Silver Star, the Bronze Star, the Parachute Badge, the Army Commendation Ribbon and Four Battle Stars.

St. Louis (NC). Edward T. Freil, manager of the Remington Rand Corporation microfilm division, has been appointed technical consultant for the Vatican microfilm project of Saint Louis University, the most extensive project ever undertaken.

The two-year operation of microfilming documents of the Vatican library will involve an estimated 42,000 manuscripts and about ten million pages.

The project, which is expected to cost over \$150,000, is being underwritten by the Knights of Columbus. It is being undertaken by the university to preserve for the western world some of man's most valuable literary possessions in case the Vatican should ever be destroyed or damaged by warfare. No duplicates of much of the materials to be photographed exist outside the Vatican.
