Hollywood In Focus

Who Can Decide Who Is The Traitor?
 Stanley Kramer's \$1,000,000 longer will be given in the movies to known Communists. This includes, of course, those who having admitted involvement in Communism have publicly repented and given tangible signs of turning over a new leaf.

How can the Hollywood movie industry convince the American public, including such segments of it as the Wage Earners Committee and similar action groups, that "Reds" and fellow travelers no longer will be employed in the studios, nor be able to unload their literary efforts upon the movie producers?

When, in fact, is a man or woman to be regarded as a wilful Red or a fellow traveler, as distinct from a former dupe who has shaken free?

MANY PEOPLE in Hollywood have been "joiners." Some of the organizations they joined were afterwards found to be Communist fronts. In most such cases it seems likely that those currently employed in the studios have left these organizations.

How to develop the truth in each individual case is a difficult problem for the Motion Picture Industry Council. Merely to get out of suspected organizations offers no positive proof of re-conversion to true Americanism.

If a man is a Communist his denial of Communism, even under oath, is valueless.

The Motion Picture Council appreciates that such men as Martin Berkeley and Edward Dmytryk, having repudiated Communism under oath, give their only reliable signs of renewed loyalty to America, by setting out publicly to undo some of the harm they have done. They are publicly helping to smoke out the remaining "Reds" and to expose the methods by which Communists wormed a way into the movie studios.
