Blood Donor Need Stressed On Program's 4th Birthday

Rochester Regional Red Cross Blood Program will celebrate its fourth birthday on Saturday, Jan. 12. Since its beginning the program has met all the blood needs of the 42 hospitals located in the 12 county area which the program serves. Since the Korean war the program has been able to send its share of whole blood and plasma to meet the blood needs of the Armed Forces who are fighting to preserve democracy and the American way of life in the war-stricken area. THIS STORY of the program's success has been made possible by the generosity of the people in this community who as volunteer donors, have contributed the blood which has been given by the Red Cross, without charge, for preserving health and saving lives. The future of the program rests with the blood giving public, who as they serve their fellow man through blood donation, are providing the security of blood for themselves by making it available at all times to all who need it. At the present time, the blood quota for the Rochester Program is 220 pints each day to take care of civilian and Armed Forces needs.
