

AFTER replying to their greet-Pope gave his exhortations.

"In the first place, frice the present reality courageously and unclaunted," the Pope told the group. "A page of history has been turned A period has been placed which indicates an erad to a social and economic past. A" new chapter has been opened which inaugurates an entirely new form of life."

The Holy Father urged the nobles to be "good sports" about the loss of their econonale power, and to act with nobility of character instead of sulking like mediocre souls.

Their "unconditional fidelity to Catholic docfrine, Christ and the Church" should be seen even by practicing Catholics as "a spectacle of irreprehensible conjugal life and exemplary edification at the domestic fireside," the Pope said. He warned them against "ruinous principles . . . and pernicious tolerances which could contaminate or smirch the purity of matrimony and the family."

IN THEIR relations to public life, the Pontiff said, "only one attitude is prohibited: 'abstentionism." Such an attitude would be opposed to the original spirit of their state and would desertion rather than flight, said, adding: "Whatever might hap pen, whatever it might cost. It is above all necessary to maintain a tight union of all the Catholic forces against every danger of even the alightest
