"Although the eighth grade population of Rochester parochial and public schools is increasing, Aquinas can meet the enrollment demands for the immediate present,

"Certain minor alterations will have to be made to accomodate next year's student body, so that all available space will be millized to capacity throughout the school day. Plans for these alterations are now completed and work will begin as soon as school closes in Junea

"The return to a single-unit school will be welcomed, it is felt, by students, parents and faculty alike. Aquinas liself is niuch more accessible than the Lagrange Avenue Amnex.

Freshmen will now find it more convenient to remain after school for participation in intermural atlaletics and other student activities. The regular bus service on Dewey Avenue will make it possible for students who remain after school to arrive home earlier for the evening meal. 
