

On Dean's List At St. John Fisher

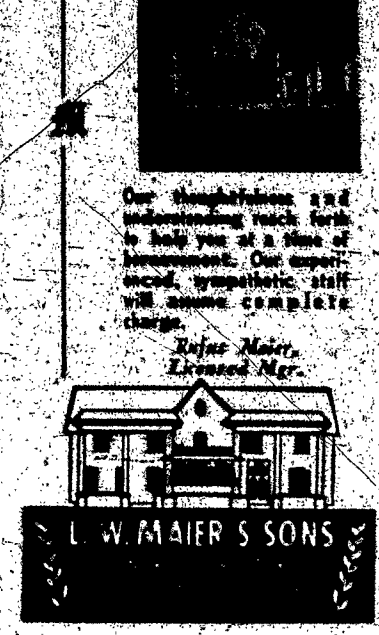
Seven students of St. John Fisher College are on the Dean's List of Honor following the semester examinations of the first semester of the first Freshman Class of the college.

Bishop Urges 4th Degree KC To Uphold U. S. Heroes

Members of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus were called upon as the patriotic section of the order, to wage a campaign to keep figures like Abraham Lincoln alive in national life.

The challenge to the Knights came from His Excellency Bishop Kearney speaking at the Lincoln's birthday banquet of the knights, Tuesday night in Sheraton Hotel.

The Bishop told how enemies of the United States are now carrying out an organized plot to discredit the memory and understanding of great American figures and their ideals and principles.

"THE DISCREDIT of Abraham Lincoln by our educators is easily apparent," he said, "how many of our grade school children can recite his famous Gettysburg Address? It's a grave mistake for our United States to let a generation lose intimacy with this great figure, from whom they could adopt his principles."

The speakers and officers of the assembly were introduced by Norman A. O'Brien, past navigator of the assembly.

Professor Noted Educator Lists Lecture At Women's College



Dr. Nicolas de Rochefort, professor in the Graduate School, Department of Political Science, at Georgetown University, will speak in Nazareth College auditorium at 1:15 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 14. His topic will be "Soviet Expansionism, the Arms Race, and the East."

Born in St. Petersburg, Russia, Nicolas de Rochefort entered the University of Paris at the age of 19 years and was graduated with honors. After serving as a Second Lieutenant, he worked for several commercial companies until 1932, when he was appointed an instructor at the University of Paris. His courses dealt with political relations between Russia and the European powers since 1900.

Fr. Schnacky To Advise In Filming Of Catechism

Appointed to a 17-man board to serve in an advisory capacity on future issues of St. John's Catechism as filmed and sound-recorded for audio-visual education is the Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, diocesan director, Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in the Diocese of Rochester.

Announcement was made by the Rev. Michael F. Mullen, C.M., director of the project sponsored by St. John's University, Brooklyn. Directed by Father Mullen, assistant professor of education at Teachers College, a group of religious of the University faculty have been engaged over a five-year period in research and study on the advantages of teaching the Catechism by means of sound filmstrip.

At present the efforts of the group will be concentrated on the Creed for which ten units will be required for completion. In all, 30 units of the sound filmstrip will be used in filming the Catechism, the project to require about three years to produce.

Second release, "God and His Perfections," and "The Blessed Trinity" will be ready for distribution next week. With this release, the newly formed Advisory Board will mark its first participation in the work; each of four school superintendents will edit the films to fit the needs of the parochial schools in their territories. The 11 Directors of the Confraternity will accept the units for public school children. Much of the released-time religious training of children is given under Confraternity direction.

At the Cleveland Seminary he was a classmate of Bishop Michael F. Brady of Columbus and Bishop John P. Treacy of La Crosse.
