Hibernian Speaker Extolls Faith He Found In Ireland

"Ireland gets you by the heart and never lets you go," the Rev. Joseph Mantion, C.S.S.R., director of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Shrine in Boston, said in recounting his trip to that nation at the fourth annual Commodore John Barry of the Monroe County, Ancient Order of Hibernians and Auxiliary, Feb. 21.

Father Mantion, nationally known for his radio addresses, spoke to the largest gathering of the annual tribute to the "father of the American Navy," in four years, at Hotel Seneca.

"THE CROSS is the highest and the faith is first," in the Emerald Isle, said Father Mantion, in a nation where rain is "holy water on the windshield," and commercialism is found absent from the Shrines of Our Blessed Mother.

The Redemptorist priest deplored the fact that Ireland's only tragedy is its finest export, thousands of "lads and colleens" leaving her shores every year. The Irish, too, he declared, will never be at peace until Ireland is united.
