

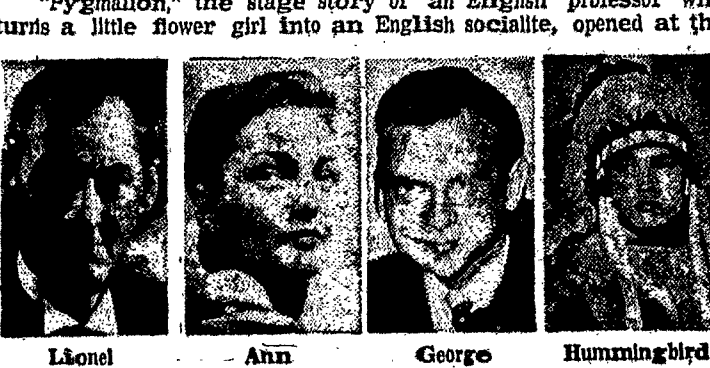
Nuns Plan Music School

The Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union will present their annual play during Passion Week. This year's presentation will be "The Dry-Martyr." Again Willford Scott will direct and the play will run for eight nights on the stage of the Aquinas Institute Auditorium. Curtain time is set for 8:30 p. m. on the evenings of March 29, 30, April 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.



"Pygmalion," the stage story of an English professor who turns a little flower girl into an English socialite, opened at the Arena Theater, Hoegher St., Rochester, Tuesday. Ann Dearing, who played with the group in the past, returns to star in this George Bernard Shaw vehicle. Others in the cast include John Vaughan, George LaBuda, Sarah Scott, Edward Ivory and Alice Boyke.

In the final of his four February radio talks under the general title, "The Bible Our Compass," the Rev. Isadore O'Brien will speak on the Sermon of the Cross Sunday over Station WARC, Rochester, at 1:30 p. m. The choir of the Theological College of the Catholic University of America, under the baton of William C. Tate, has been a feature of the program.

For the first time in history a full-blooded American Indian appeared as the star on a television show recently. Called "Son of the Eagle," the program featured Hummingbird, a 17-year-old Indian. The boy received his elementary education from the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament in Santa Fe and was granted a private audience by the Holy Father during a Holy Year pilgrimage.

Coming to the Loew's Rochester Theater, the "Lone Star," rated A-1, is not a distinguished picture. Lionel Barrymore plays President Andrew Jackson aptly but Clark Gable will need better film material than this picture if he is to maintain his position among the stars.

For those who look for a movie filled with unrelieved tension the Cinema Theater, Rochester, will present "The Well." Rated A-2 by the Legion of Decency, the film is apt to attract the morbid type patron.

The Trapp Singers, world-famed a cappella choral group under the conductorship of the Very Rev. Msgr. Franz Wagner, have been selected by the National Catholic Welfare Conference for the honor of providing a musical introduction and postlude for the Annual Ash Wednesday message of the Holy Father to the American School Children. The Holy Father's Address will be carried on both CBS and NBC networks, on Wednesday, Feb. 27.

A variety show under the title, "Belle of the West," is having its final polishing before the St. Ambrose Youth Club, Rochester, presents the show Feb. 25 and 26 in the parish hall. William McCarty of Aquinas Institute faculty and the Rev. Roy Hagerly, moderator of the club, are directing the show.
