

## Conversion

New Ideas Needed, Says English Priest

London -(NC)- New techniques to make the Faith better known are needed to raise the number of conversions in England and Wates from the preset average of 10,000 a year, according to the Rev. Michael. O'Connor, pastor of Carlisle, in the northwest.

Father O'Connor, who runs an inquiry class for non-Catholics — it is known as the "Carlisle experiment" and is based on the American method -believes that if every parish in England and Wales brought in 50 converts a year, conversions would soon be on a 100,000 a-year basis.

The priest maintains that Catholicism has made little practical progress in England over the past 100 years. He told a meeting here:

"Let us suppose we are only 3,500,000 or 4,000,000. We are then approximately one in 15. One hundred years ago, we were 1,000,000 and we were then one in 15. too."

"There is a very smug be-Hef that Protestantism has dled," Father O'Connor added, we never think that what is taking its place is not Catholicism but paganism." Catholics in the United States,

Father O'Connor declared, have left no stone unturned to make the Falth known. "They have tried everything,

including radio," he said. "As a result they have gone forward In leaps and bounds in the past five or six years."


