New Nocturnal Adoration Center Set For See City

Planned to increase the number of nocturnal adoration men in the See City of Rochester, a second center of the Nocturnal Adoration Society will be canonically established in Blessed Sacrament Church on Saturday night, March 29, from 10 to 11 p. m.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will preside at the ceremony which will have in attendance men from seven parishes in the southern region of the city. Parishes besides Blessed Sacrament will include St. Mary's, Our Lady of Lourdes, Corpus Christi, St. John the Evangelist, St. Boniface and St. Louis, Pittsford.

battlefronts. Even distant Poland whose queen had formerly been a Lady of Charity, now sought the services of St. Louise and her Sisters. Thus the first foreign mission was established.

THE SUCCESS of the new Community delighted St. Vincent but it was 25 years before he finally yielded to Louise and appealed to Rome for approbation of the new society and for its formal placement under the authority of the Superior of the Congregation of the Mission. With the Pope's ratification they became the "Daughters of Charity, Servants of the Poor." The lay association, however, still retains the title "Ladies of Charity."

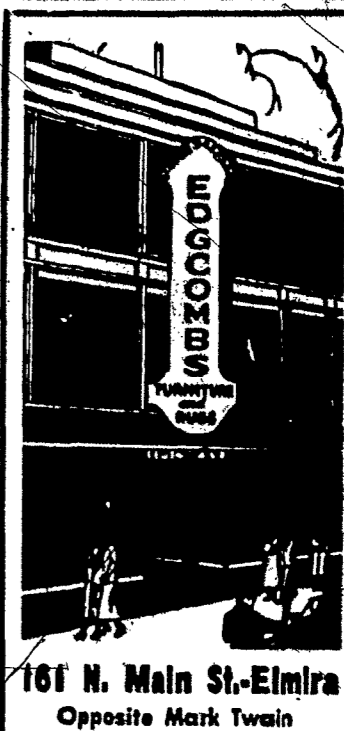
