Bishop Kearney Endorses Traffic Safety Campaign

The Rochester Jaycees "Traffic Safety Month" Campaign, consisting of "Four Weeks of Safety" which opened on Monday has the hearty endorsement of His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Purpose of the campaign is to help educate the public regarding traffic safety, in an effort to keep Rochester the safest of the 38 largest cities in the United States and to further reduce the number of traffic accidents and fatalities.

The campaign has been set up with assistance of the Department of Public Safety, the Rochester Safety Council, and other groups interested in traffic safety.

Mayor Dicker proclaimed "Traffic Safety Month" and the "Four Weeks of Safety."

WORK ON the campaign is being handled by the Traffic and Safety Committee of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, under the direction of William C. Huggins, II, committee chairman, and John

F. Forsyth, civic affairs vice president. Raymond A. Lander Jr. is general chairman of the campaign.

The "Four Weeks of Safety" and aims are:

"Traffic Courtesy Week, April 13-19. Purpose of this week is

to try to promote safe driving habits through courtesy.

"Child (Traffic) Safety Week," April 20-26. Purpose to try to promote safety for children in regard to bicycles and cars. This week ties in with the National Safety Council's month of April theme of "Child Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety." It will also try to draw attention to the city's bicycle licensing ordinance which requires licensing of bicycles after May 1.

"Pedestrian Safety Week," April 27-May 3. Purpose to try to promote safe walking habits. It is also a follow-up of the 1951 Jaycee anti-jaywalking campaign.

"Car Inspection Week," May 4-10. Purpose of this week is to try to promote the operation of safe automobiles. This week ties in with the National Safety Council's month of "Vehicle Maintenance." It will also draw attention to the advantages of a compulsory vehicle inspection law such as may eventually be passed by New York State.

The campaign will be augmented with safety floats, courtesy projects to stress safety.
