## 4 New Coaches Named, 4-Year Football Training Course Launched At Aquinas

An expansion of the athletic program at Aquinas Institute, consisting of a four-year Football Training Course, a wider range of sporting activities and an enlarged coaching staff, was announced today by Rev. Cyril Carter, C.S.B., Director of Athletics at the Dewey Avenue school.

Raymond (Ray) Jablonski, Aquinas physical education instructor and baseball coach, has been designated as Head Football Coach for the 1952 season.

**ASSISTING** Jablonski in the capacity of first assistant varsity coach will be Harry O'Neill, for the past two seasons football coach at Canandaigua Academy.

Frank Vadas has been retained as coach of the Aquinas Jayvee football squad and will work closely with Ray Jablonski and Harry O'Neill on the Varsity level.

Louis Basile, Director of the Department of Physical Education and Health at Aquinas, has been named head basketball coach for the 1952-53 season. Along with Rev. John Wilson, C.S.B., freshman football coach, and two other coaches yet to be appointed, Mr. Basile will serve on the seven-man football coaching staff.

**FATHER CARTER** explained that the football coaching staff has been doubled in size, in conformity with the school's revised athletic policy. All of the 1600 Aquinas students will be given an opportunity to play football, to receive proper conditioning for the game, and to enroll in the Football Training Course.

"Abandoning competition with Prep Schools does not mean that we are de-emphasizing football at Aquinas," Father Carter stated. "We believe in football. We know from experience that it makes a great contribution to the education of a high school boy. We shall emphasize it, if anything, more than ever."

"We have long since discovered the secret of turning out great players and great teams. We have not lost that secret. We shall continue to turn out great players and great teams."

The Aquinas campus is being improved and enlarged, Father Carter said, to accommodate more intra-mural fall and spring sports. The athletic program will be expanded to include soccer and track, in addition to football, basketball, baseball, boxing, golf, swimming and bowling.

## Secularists, Reds Travel Same Route, Says Fr. Flynn

Dansville — The American secularist and the foreign communist have a lot in common, the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, editor of the Catholic Courier Journal, told members of St. Mary's Holy Name Society here Tuesday evening.

Citing secularist and communist opposition to religious schools, Father Flynn said "there is no mystery in the fact that more and more we find the secularist and the communist on the same side of the fence. Both are bent on keeping God and all that stands for God out of our modern society."

Father Flynn expressed fear that the polite atheism of secularism will become more identified with the militant atheism of communism.

Today the American secularist joins the alien communists in attacking religious schools. Tomorrow he may join the communists in telling us to close our churches.

"Today the secularist has joined hands with the communist in scripping the Ten Commandments. This gives us every reason to fear that tomorrow the secularist will join hands with the communist in scripping the Bill of Rights."
