**Women's Role In Religion Stressed By CDA Speaker**

Corning — Speaking before 70 members of Court St. Joseph, Catholic Daughters of America, at their annual banquet Sunday evening in the Baron Steuben Hotel, the Rev. Thomas Cleary, chaplain at George Junior Republic, spoke urgently for the need of a return to the basic teachings of religion. Father Cleary, formerly assistant pastor at St. Patrick's Church here, cited the gain in materialistic standards over the past fifty years in comparison with the decline of the spiritual standard. He stressed the importance of woman's place in the home and community and told his hearers that they can do much in bringing religion into its rightful place in both fields.

**Kreckel Heard In Organ Recital At Erie Cathedral**

At the console of "one of the largest and finest Catholic Church organs in the country," Philip G. Kreckel, as guest organist, played a program of classic and contemporary organ music at St. Peter's Cathedral, Erie, Pa. on April 15.

The organ, according to Professor Kreckel, organist at St. Boniface Church, Rochester, was recently completed by the Tellers Organ Company. Organ architects classified it as "the largest and finest," he said. "The dignity and impressiveness of the instrument are greatly enhanced by the resonance of this spacious cathedral. The chancel organ located near the sanctuary is strictly an accompanimental organ and there are two consoles from which both organs can be played. Upon hearing this magnificent organ one realizes that there is no worthy substitute for the pipe organ; also one can more fully understand the words of Pope Plus XII in his famous Encyclical on church music, namely: 'The pipe organ has by reason of its extraordinary grandeur and majesty been considered a worthy adjunct to the liturgy.'"
