## Legion of Mary Forms Unit In Watkins Glen

Watkins Glen — A unit of the Legion of Mary has been formed in St. Mary's of the Lake parish, Watkins Glen, under the direction of the Rev. Benedict A. Ehmman, Pastor. Three probationary meetings have already been held, one each week. After six such meetings, formal approval of the new Praesidium will be sought from the next highest governing body, the Curia which is located in Rochester. The name of the Watkins Glen Praesidium, subject to Curial approval, will be Maria Assumpta. Twelve members are affiliated and serving their probation.

Organized in 1921 in Dublin, Ireland, the Legion of Mary has grown amazingly and has done an immense amount of apostolic work all over the world. Where it is given a mandate by the Bishop, it is an arm of authentic Catholic Action.

Notable work has been done by the Legion in China and India. Recent news reports show the Legion of Mary holding firmly to its standards during the persecutions of the Church in China, and safeguarding the faith during the expulsion of the bishops and priests.
