Pope Urges Bank Workers To Live Faith

Vatican City — (NC) — Several thousand employees of the Bank of Italy and government workers heard an admonition from His Holiness Pope Pius XII to practice their Faith openly and courageously and not let it remain "in the catacomb of your private life."

The government employees were received in audience by the Holy Father after the conclusion of their annual Easter retreat and Communion. The Pope told them that "today it is more urgent, perhaps, than ever, that they should give public demonstration of their Faith."

"EXERCISE YOUR Faith, therefore," he urged his hearers, "revitalize and live it, even in public, spread it abroad with open word and courageous example to your children and to all with whom you come in contact."

The Pope warned the workers against "the fear of fallacious public opinion, and the natural greed which is within you," that might cause them "to lose freedom of judgment and deliberation."

"IN OUR HEARTS," the Pontiff said, "there is a hope which we wish were turned to certainty. If all men thirsted today for the Word of God and ran after Jesus to hear Him, it would not be difficult, perhaps, God willing, to witness a new and mysterious and more splendid multiplication of the lower."

In the course of his talk, Pope Pius wished a blessing on "every intelligent, honest effort" in the field of national economy which "makes possible new progress toward filling the need of all those who live by daily labor, so that they would be enabled to provide for the needs of their families and for a fitting and Christian education of their children."

RCIA Officer Ordained Priest

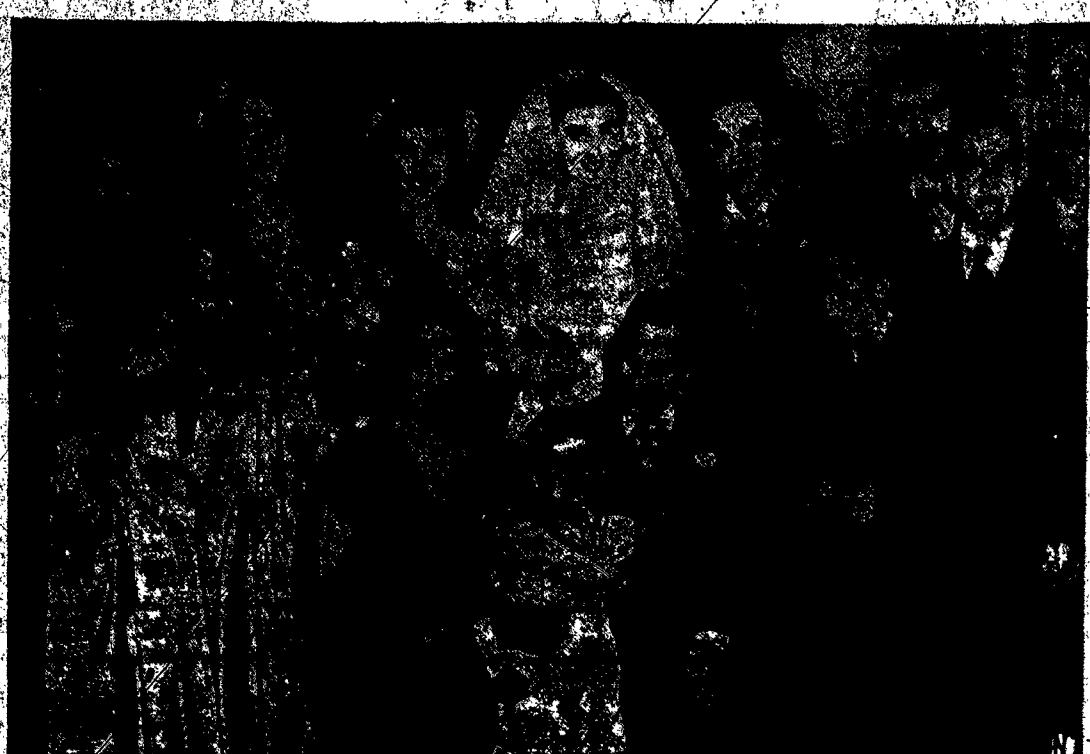

Hungarian Reds Begin Ouster Of Order Priests In Parishes

Vienna — (NC) — The Hungarian communist regime has launched a new drive against priests of religious orders who were ousted from their monasteries through a decree in late 1950.

After the "dissolution" of almost all monasteries in Hungary by the communist regime, the priests offered themselves to bishops for work in parishes. The regime is now moving to drive them from parish work.

NOTICE OF THIS move came in a letter sent to order priests in the Eger archdiocese, the See of His Eminence Josef Cardinal Mindszenty, which is now being administered by Bishop Andrew Hamvas of Csanak.

The letter was allegedly signed by Bishop Hamvas. It told the religious that they could no longer engage in pastoral work in the archdiocese.

"I regret to inform you," the letter said, "that I am compelled by the order of the State Office for Church Affairs, to relieve you of your present duties. If you wish to continue in your priestly functions, you will have to find an Ordinary who is in a position to employ you. In the Archdiocese of Eger this is not the case now. You will be allowed to say Holy Mass, except in an unofficial capacity and outside the usual hours."

Church Belongs To Christ, Says Prelate

Boston — (NC) — The Catholic belongs totally and exclusively to Christ and is not a political organization, Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston told the 30th annual convention of the Newman Clubs of New England at Emmanuel College here.

His declaration, aimed at anti-Catholic principles, "contained a warning that conditions which befall the Church in communist dominated countries can happen here and easily might if certain tendencies abroad in the land go unrebuked and undisciplined."

THE PRELATE said that to talk of the Church in terms of democracy, socialism, fascism or any other "ism" is as pointless as it would be to talk of Jesus Christ in these terms. The Catholic Church, he went on, is not a democracy for it is not a political organization, not a cultural society, not a debating forum and it is not a religious or philosophical parliament.

"I make no difference between Christ and His Church, it is all one," the archbishop declared. "Christ did not come as a result of a Plebiscite but by the sovereign mandate of His Father. He did not come as a result of a resolution adopted by men, however high-minded they were."

"The Church is not the property of princes, prelates, nor the property of the people totally. She belongs to Jesus Christ in that sense and in that sense only. 'Strictly spiritual, the Church belongs totally to Jesus Christ,' he said."
