Enthusiastic audiences kept actors in Holy Family Theater's



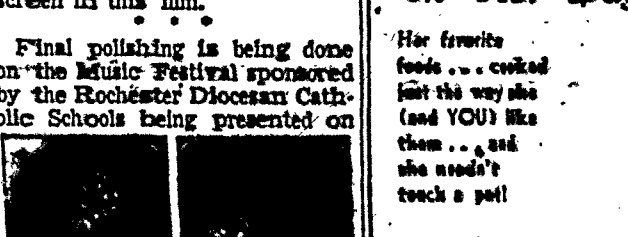
