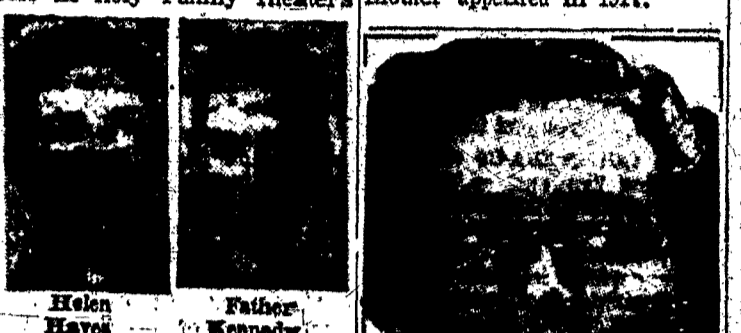
'Jubilee Minstrels' Cast Promises Top Entertainment
