

Writing in Life magazine under the name of Josip Broz-Tito, the communist master of Belgrade. rehashes virtually the same charges against Archbishop Stepinac that he seized the opporunity to make in a letter to newspaper columnist Drew Pearon last November.

Sister Marcelline was the principal speaker at the Diocesan Congress of Catholic Women, Sister Marcelline spent her last two years in China under communist rufe and was imprisoned for 15 months before she was expelled.

"In the persecuted China of today," the Maryknoll mun related, "we have lived to see the time when women - virgins or mothers, and even little
