The impressive consecration of the Most Rev. Lionel Audet, second Auxiliary to Archbishop Maurice Roy of Quebec on May 1 was of special interest in this diocese to Mr. and Mrs. Frank P. Audet of 233 Seymour St., Auburn.

Mr. Audet is a cousin of the 42-year-old prelate who was formerly superior of Quebec's Upper Seminary.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will preside over the May day festivities and bless the new statue of Our Lady on the north campus of Our Lady of Mercy Motherhouse on Monday, May 18.

The day's program will be opened with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass celebrated at 10 o'clock by Bishop Kearney at the outdoor altar erected on the auditorium steps. The student body in uniform will circle the east campus while the seniors will form a guard of honor for the May Queen and her court.

CYNTHIA BALCONI, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Henry F. Balconi of East Avenue, has been elected by her classmates to be "May Queen." Ellen Wilson and Mary Scheld are her maids of honor.

Following the Mass the students will march to the front of the convent singing the famous Lourdes hymn. Flanked on both sides of the Bishop's and the queen's throne they will participate in the blessing ceremonies of the statue before the crowning.

The new statue of Carrara marble is exported from Italy. It is called the Immaculate Heart of Mary of Our Lady of Fatima. Plans to be developed in the near future call for beautifying the convent lawn by the placement of shrubs and bushes at the stone base of the statue and for unique lighting facilities.

After the blessing, Queen Cynthia will place her crown upon Our Lady's head. The clergy and laity present will join in the concluding prayers.

## Diocesan Pilgrims Sail Saturday For Barcelona

Under the personal direction of the Rev. John E. Maney, D.D., Vice Chancellor of the Diocese of Rochester, a group of 14 pilgrims from this diocese will sail noon Saturday, May 17 from New York for the 33rd International Eucharistic Congress in Barcelona, Spain.

The Congress scheduled to begin on May 27 will be preceded by a triduum of spiritual preparations in the various Barcelona Churches, beginning on Sunday, May 25 with pilgrims from all parts of the world participating.

The Rochester Diocese pilgrims will be led "Bon Voyage and God Speed" by His Excellency Bishop Kearney in New York on Saturday. The Bishop with whose approval the pilgrimage is being conducted will be at Pier 84 as the party goes aboard the Saturnia of the American Export Line.

TWO OTHER priests of this diocese will be in the group. They are the Rev. William A. Doran, pastor of St. Ann's Church, Palmyra and the Rev. Charles J. Azil, pastor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church, Rochester.
