The biggest job in the library is done behind the scenes and Davis is in charge of this prepbered consecutively, according to the number of books in the library. For example the first book library receives will have the

number one, and the last one may be 28,099. Next the library stamp is put in the book for identification. CATALOG CARDS FOR each book are received from the Li- braries, and adult or children's ronage of the Episcopal Corhmit-

brary of Congress. When they arrive each card is complete with title, author and subject matter. Any additional information is typed on them in the individual libraries. These cards are placed in the card catalogue for reference at any time.

Every non-fiction book in a library is given a classification number according to the Deway Decimal System, numbers ranging from 000 to 999. From 000-100 you can find books on journalism, the history of philosophy of journalism, books on libraries and their histories, or other general works: from 200-299, books on religion; 400-499, languages; 800-899, literature; 900-999, his-

This classification number plus the first three letter of the author's last name (200.1—SHE), are printed on the spine of the book. The cover is then shellacked. When the card-pocket and date-due slip are pasted inside the back cover, the cataloging is completed, and the book is ready for circulation.
