

Mother Seton Letter Given To Library

New York (NC)—An original letter by Elizabeth Bayley Seton to her husband — "my dearest, treasure" — was presented to St. Peter's Catholic Lending Library here in a ceremony at St. Peter's Church, oldest Catholic church in New York and the site of Mother Seton's reception into the Catholic Faith in 1805.

THE AFFECTIONATE letter was written in 1794, the first year of her marriage, by Mother Seton, who after she was widowed, founded the Sisters of Charity in this country. Her cause for beatification is now in Rome.

This record is kept in order to tell how much each book is used. Miss Davis also reviews new pamphlets and magazines in order to refer faculty members to articles when they are of value to their particular classes.

Among the large selection of highly specialized magazines in the Nazareth College Library are The Journal of Nursing, The Federal Reserve Bulletin, The Aster Arts, The American Journal of Archaeology, the Musical Quarterly, Mathematics Teacher, and Radio Age.

CATALOG CARDS FOR each book are received from the Library of Congress. When they arrive each card is complete with title, author and subject matter. Any additional information is typed on them in the individual libraries. These cards are placed in the card catalogue for reference at any time.

Every non-fiction book in a library is classified according to the Dewey Decimal System, numbers ranging from 000 to 999. From 000-100 you can find books on journalism, the history of philosophy and their histories, or other general works; from 200-299, books on religion; 400-499, languages; 500-899, literature; 900-999, history.

Interest Grows In Bible Week Set Next Fall

Washington (NC)—Wide-spread interest in the Bible Week from September 28 to October 5, marking the 50th anniversary of the Catholic Gutenberg Bible, the first printed book, is evidenced in the daily mail received by the Catholic Biblical Association of America which together with the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine is sponsoring the observance.

IN ADDITION to honoring the Catholic layman, Johann Gutenberg, who selected the Latin Vulgate Edition of the Bible as compiled by St. Jerome as the first book to be printed from movable type, the week will mark one of the greatest accomplishments of American Catholic Biblical scholarship—the publication of the first of four volumes of the Old Testament, translated directly from the original languages.

THE MINIMUM beginner's salary for trained librarians is \$3,057 a year, according to the American Library Association, Miss Davis said. She said that anyone who has initiative and imagination, who likes people and wants to serve his community, who has a broad background of knowledge, and who loves books and wants to share and foster this love, would be a good librarian.

Miss Davis indicated that well-trained librarians in larger libraries receive salaries from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per year.

Rebuild Slums Or Prepare New Jails, Prelate Warns

Montreal (NC)—Reconstruct slums or else get ready to build prisons, reform schools and insane asylums to rehabilitate those whose lives are being blighted in them.

Montreal's businessmen were faced with this choice by Archbishop Paul-Emile Leger, who took the businessmen to task for not heeding his request of a year ago to act to remedy slum conditions here.

"IF YOU KEEP the slums in this city," he warned, "prepare for tomorrow's generation reform schools, divorce courts, prisons, sanatoriums, insane asylums — rehabilitation centers which will cost you millions and billions."

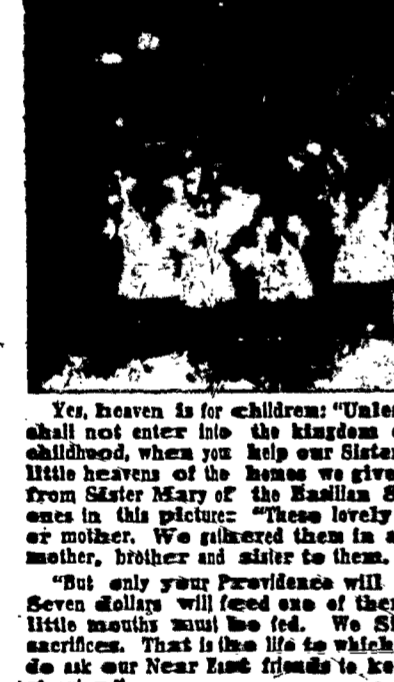
