Diocesan H. N. Men Hear Speaker Cite Democracy's Foundation In Religion

Scoring recent allegations that "private schools" are "divisive" in a democracy, the Rev. Donald M. Cleary told Holy Name delegates in Elmira Sunday that "democracy itself, as a political theory, is an outgrowth of religious teaching."

Father Cleary, Catholic chaplain at Cornell University and principal speaker at the 18th annual convention of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union, pointed out that "the very beginnings of education in the formative days of American democracy were religious."

More than 200 delegates from parish Holy Name Societies throughout the diocese attended the afternoon session in St. Mary's Auditorium heard Father Cleary declare:

Even Harvard College, the oldest of them all, was a religious institution, and today has numbered among its colleges a Theological College for the training of ministers.

"It would seem, therefore, that if private schools were a divisive factor in American democracy, that that democracy should have been doomed from the very beginning."

The speaker concluded with a plea that Holy Name men immerse themselves on the issues confronting educators today.
