St. Bonaventure, N. Y. — The Most Rev. Sigebald Kurz, O.F.M., D.D., Bishop of Yungchow, China, will preside and present diplomas to the graduates at St. Bonaventure University's 52d commencement Sunday, June 8. Bishop Kurz also will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

'Trappist Monks' Bread' To Go On Sale In City

"Trappist Monks' Bread," produced by the Cistercians at Our Lady of the Genesee Monastery in Piffard, will be available to Rochesterians beginning next week at St. Francis of Assisi Parish Center, 401 Orange St.

Persons desiring to obtain the two-pound loaves, priced at 50 cents, may call at the Center on Monday through Friday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p. m.

Wider distribution of the "Trappist" bread — which for several months has been available to purchasers in small quantities — is being made possible by completion this week of the new "bakery shop" at the year-old foundation near Genesee. It will turn out between 300 and 400 loaves daily.

THE "BAKERY" is a small shed donated to the Trappists by the Rev. Arthur F. Florack and parishioners of St. Michael's Church, Rochester. Formerly located on the parish property, the shed was transported to Piffard and has been equipped with a

dough-mixer and an 80-lb. oven. Production of bread and cheese is a traditional means by which Trappist monks become self-supporting. Manufacture of cheese is an eventual goal of monks in the Rochester Diocese, who now have a dairy herd of 15 cows.

Principal product of the Trappist monastery in Gethsemane, Kentucky, is cheese, which is distributed widely throughout the nation, and is one of the best-selling items in the Macy store in New York.

WHEN THE bread-making began here and was sampled by the Gethsemane monks, the latter placed an order at the Piffard mill where the Piffard community obtains its flour. The "Monks' Bread" is reported to be particularly nutritious, made of whole wheat flour and specially enriched unbleached flour to which are added milk and extra wheat germ.

All orders for the bread are being accepted at the Piffard monastery provided the cost of postage is included with the order, it was announced. It is intended eventually to dispense the bread through stores and outlets in various communities of the diocese if the demand warrants the announcement stated.
