

National Laywomen Retreat Unit Names Cenacle Delegate

Miss Geraldine Moylan who has been associated with Rochester Cenacle, 695 East Ave., Rochester since its foundation in 1948 was a delegate to a meeting of the National Laywomen's Retreat Movement Legislative Council in Pittsburgh, June 6 to 8.

Miss Moylan was appointed to the publicity committee for the organization's ninth national congress to be held in Kansas City, Mo., in September 1953.

DELEGATES TO the Pittsburgh meeting were from 22 retreat houses in 13 states and Canada. They formulated a policy on national congresses, regional conferences, and individual memberships which will be sent to all member houses and leagues.

National Laywomen's Retreat Movement is an association of laywomen affiliated with retreat houses and organizations which offer or sponsor closed retreats for laywomen.

NINE members, numbering 57, reported that 58,573 women made closed retreats in 1951. This means that each woman spent at least 48 hours at a retreat house following a special plan of meditation and prayer. With increased facilities and new house openings, it is estimated that more than 78,000 women will make closed retreats in 1952.

Valley Forge Shrine Nearing Completion

Valley Forge, Pa. — (RNS) — A Memorial to Catholic servicemen of all wars is nearing completion at Valley Forge, a Pennsylvania State Park, and the nation's greatest shrine to the troops of the Revolutionary War.

Although only half completed, several thousand Catholic War Veterans from this state were given a preview of the shrine church at a cornerstone and flag-raising ceremony. Auxiliary Bishop Joseph M. McShea, of Philadelphia, officiated.

The memorial will be known as the Memorial Shrine and Church of St. Theresa of Avila. It will be located on Route 363, just outside the park limits and about a mile from the present St. Theresa's church, at Port Kennedy, which dates to 1818.

The Rev. Charles D. Collins, rector of the church and of the nearby Phoenixville Protectors for Boys, said that the new church will accommodate 500. It is designed to serve a growing community as well as a focal point for the thousands who visit the historic camping grounds of Washington's troops every week to see the original buildings and monuments.

The Washington Memorial Episcopal Chapel, in the park proper, has for some years been a general Catholic worship center, including a service conducted every Sunday at 3 p. m. for all of the 48 states.

Senate Hikes Charity Deduction To 20 Per Cent For Income Tax

Washington — (NC) — Individuals would be permitted to deduct up to a fifth of their income for gifts of charity under a bill passed by the Senate.

At present only 15 per cent of income may be deducted for this purpose under tax provisions.

The Senate amended a House measure to increase the deduction to 20 per cent. The bill now goes to conference.

In the House bill, proceeds of sports programs conducted for the benefit of the American National Red Cross were excluded from gross incomes for income tax purposes. Object of this provision was to allow professional baseball clubs to devote a day's proceeds to the Red Cross.

Senator George of Georgia, chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, explained on the floor that many other charities wished to be included in the Red Cross provision. He said, however, that it would defeat the provision's purpose if they were included, since the baseball clubs could not afford to give away successive days of their income for different charities.

At the same time, the chairman added, "the committee was of the opinion that many hospitals, small colleges, and charitable institutions were

Pope Exhorts Scout Leaders

Vatican City — (NC) — Catholic Boy Scout leaders were told by His Holiness Pope Pius XII that "the formation of character, which is the principal scope of scouting, must have a clearly social and apostolic orientation."

The Holy Father spoke at an audience to participants in the Seventh International Congress of Leaders of Catholic Scouting, the first to be held in Rome.

He said that thirty years of experience have "amply demonstrated the value of character formation in scouting. What splendid figures of great Christians, heroes, leaders, how many religious and sacerdotal vocations have been born among your ranks."

Apostolic Career Urged On Graduates

Dubuque, Ia. — (NC) — "Graduation from a Catholic college means not merely the beginning of a career, but also and chiefly the entering upon a vocation, the inception of an apostolic career."

With these words a noted priest-editorialist summed up his message to Clarke College graduates here. He is the Rev. John S. Kennedy, editor of the Catholic Transcript, Hartford diocesan newspaper, and the NCWO Feature Service book reviewer.

Comparing modern times with early Christian days, Father Kennedy pointed out the parallel between the commencement exercises and the occasion of the first Pentecost.


Nursing School Admits All Races
