

### Chaplain Gefell At Beuron Abbey

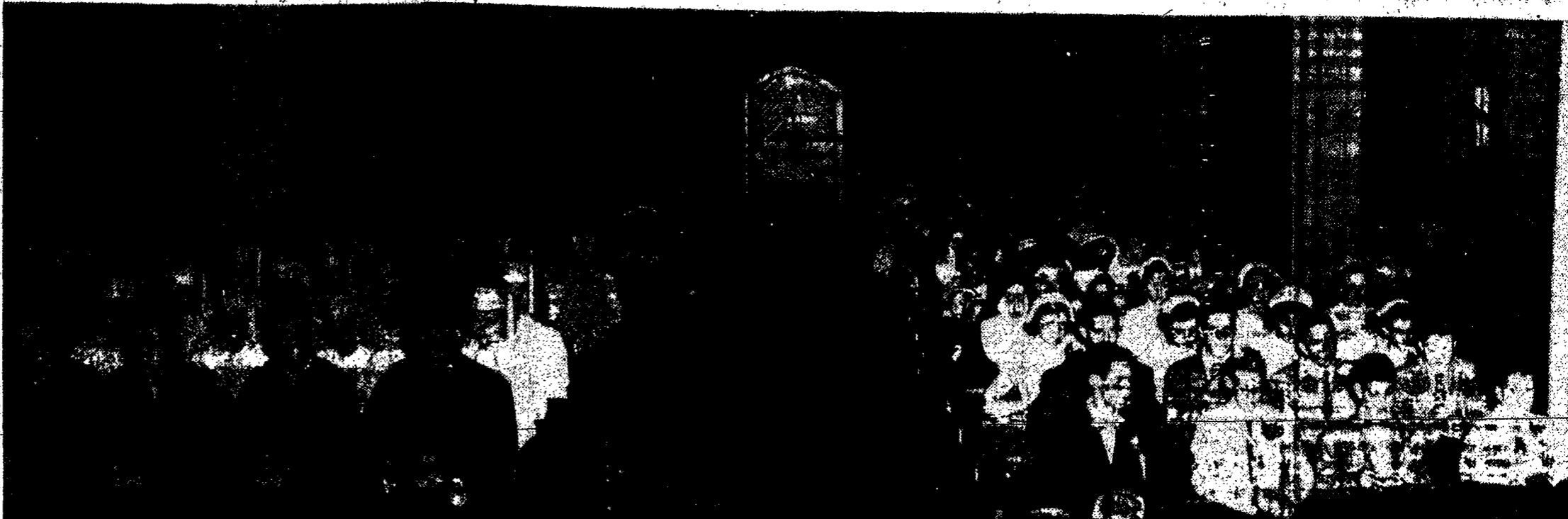
A priest of the Rochester diocese took part in an outdoor Corpus Christi procession in Beuron, Germany, with more than 100 other U. S. military chaplains on retreat at the world-famed Benedictine Abbey in Beuron.

The retreat was led by Mgr. (Col.) John S. Kelly, Chief of Chaplains of the European Command. Chaplain Gefell was given a place in the procession immediately following the Most Rev. Benedict Bauer, O.S.B., Archbishop of Beuron. He was accompanied by the Rev. (Lt. Col.) Albert Knier — and the Rev. (Capt.) Gerard Gefell, the latter of Rochester diocese.

The Rev. Robert Nash, S.J., of Dublin, Ireland, was retreat master to the chaplains. They came from all over the European command area, from Germany, Austria, France, England, Italy, North Africa and Turkey to take part in the three-day exercises, which were enhanced by the liturgy of the Benedictine community.

Evening rosary and benediction services were held for the American group in Our Lady's Chapel, where they created considerable interest among the pilgrims who flock to the center from various parts of the country, especially on high holidays.

### St. Bernard Grad Marks 40 Years

Saranac Lake — An alumnus of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, the Rt. Rev. Mgr. James R. McClure, pastor of St. Bernard's Church, here, celebrated the 40th anniversary of his ordination to the Holy Priesthood on June 8, 1912. He was a member of the first class ordained by Bishop Joseph H. Conroy of Ogdensburg.

He served as assistant at Chubbuck, Hogsburg, Canton and Harrisville. In 1917 he was transferred to Sacketts Harbor where he served as pastor until 1930 when he was sent to Chateaugay. He served as pastor there for 20 years until sent to Saranac Lake on March 17, 1950.

The jubilarian was elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor by Pope Pius XII on August 30, 1950.

### Their Education Is Sound, Avon School Graduates Told

Avon — The Rev. Charles E. Muckle, pastor of St. Agnes Church, awarded diplomas to 15 graduates and prizes to other pupils of St. Agnes School at the annual commencement exercises held in St. Agnes Church, June 22 at 8 p.m.

Commencement speaker was the Rev. Edward A. Shamon, assistant pastor of St. Agnes Church.

"Schools are to teach, not whom they teach should determine what they teach," Father Shamon said in stressing the soundness of the education which these graduates had received up to this moment.

"If young people attending the schools of our country are simply pieces of clay then modern education is right in molding them as we would little pieces of clay. If they are simply combinations of chemical elements, then modern education is correct in treating them as we would chemicals in a scientific laboratory. If they are simply animals with minds then modern education is right in seeking to pack those minds full of knowledge.

"But man is not simply a creature composed of mind to think but also will to act. A system of education, therefore, that seeks to pack the mind with knowledge and neglects the will is not only imperfect and awkward, but even vicious and dangerous.

"Modern educators state that knowledge is power. It is power, indeed, but a power which cuts two ways. An accountant, for instance, can use his knowledge either to help his employer or to swindle him."

"YOU CAN KNOW the Commandments of God inside out and yet you may not have the power to keep one of them. Modern educators, mistake has been in education without religion. Modern educators have passed out the dynamite of knowledge right and left with never a thought of training people on how to use it."

The speaker told how our public educational system started out to be neutral and ended up being godless.

"The power in character building," Father Shamon said, "comes from religion, for religion is the only science which can train a man on how to use
