**Catholic Daughters To Convene At Lake Placid**

The urgent need for "career" women in Catholic Action was recognized at a pre-convention meeting in Lake Placid of the Catholic Daughters of America.

The delegates decided to do something about it at the 24th biennial national convention which opens in the Lake Placid Club next Monday and continues until July 11.

The convention is an historical event in the history of the State and also for the national CDA.

**INTEREST HERE** in the convention's entertainment program is heightened by the announcement that Jessica Dragonette, soprano, concert and radio star and remembered in Rochester for singing at the Holy Name Society Holy Hour in Red-Wing Stadium in 1949 and Mary Ann Whitley, Nazareth College and Eastman School of Music student, will be soloists for the convention.

The convention will inaugurate the golden jubilee years observance of the CDA. The organization was founded in Utica, N. Y., in July, 1903, and expanded from the original 60 members to 200,000 throughout the United States in Puerto Rico, Cuba, Panama and Alaska.

Themes of the convention will be "World Peace—A Mission From God and Humanity," Bishop J. Donald C. Auxiliary of New York and CDA New York State chaplain.

The ranks of CDA officialdom is sprinkled with "career" women in Catholic Action. It was pointed out, Supreme Regent Frances Maher of Kane, Pa., has given 45 years of service to the organization and became its head two years ago. Others include:

Mrs. Margaret J. Buckley, a bank secretary by day in Washington, D. C., who devotes most of her leisure time to CDA affairs, and is supreme vice regent.
