## First High Mass Of Franciscan At St. Patrick's

The Rev. Donnan M. O'Neill, ordained a priest in the Order of Friars Minor of the Franciscans last Saturday, celebrated his first Solemn High Mass at 11 last Sunday morning at St. Patrick's Church, Elmira.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien, V.F., pastor, was Assistant Priest. The Rev. Leo G. Schwab was deacon and the Rev. William A. Burns was sub-deacon. The Very Rev. Caslan J. Following the Mass, there was a dinner in Father Donnan's honor at the Langwell Hotel attended by about 225 persons. About 800 attended a reception at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph O'Neill of 309 Welles St.

Father Donnan will remain in Elmira until July 5, when he will go to Butler, N. J., where he is assigned for the summer. In September he will return to Holy Name College in Washington to complete his studies.

## Jesuit Priest Sings First Solemn Mass At St. Mary's

The Rev. Paul Edwin Sheehan, S. J., ordained at Woodstock, Md., as a priest of the Society of Jesus, celebrated his first Solemn High Mass at 11 last Sunday morning at St. Mary's Church, Elmira.

The Rev. Thomas J. Toole, pastor, was Assistant Priest. The Rev. Francis Kelly was deacon and the Rev. Frederick Walz was sub-deacon. Rev. Joseph Cantillon, S. J., of St. Peter's College in Jersey City gave the sermon.

IN HIS SHORT sermon, Father Cantillon pointed out that the new priest was a "divinely chosen middleman between God and all men." He said Father Sheehan would "imitate the very actions of Christ's life while Our Lord was here on earth."

At 6 in the afternoon, Father Sheehan presided at Solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in the church with Father Toole as deacon and the Rev.

Leo G. Schwab as sub-deacon. The Benediction followed a reception held from 3 to 6 in the afternoon in St. Mary's Recreation Center attended by about 800 persons.

Monday morning at 8, Father Sheehan celebrated Mass in the chapel at the Dunn Memorial in memory of his father, the late Daniel Sheehan.

Tuesday morning, he celebrated Mass at 10 at the Capuchin Fathers Home at Kildereen-Cayuga, the former Summer home of the Sheehan family, in memory of his sister, Mrs. John J. McNamee, who died in a New Year's Day fire this year.

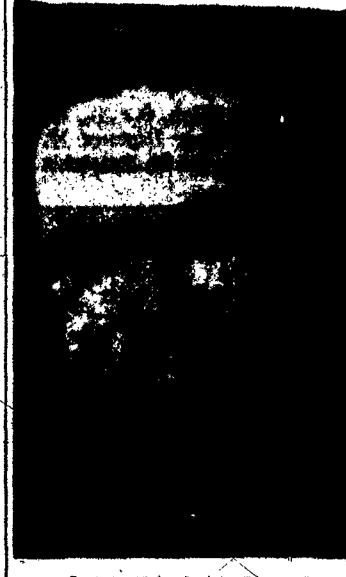
ALL HIS living and deceased relatives and friends were remembered in a Mass celebrated Wednesday morning at 8 at Our Lady of Lourdes Church.

Father Sheehan, who has completed 13 years of the training required to become a Jesuit priest and missionary, will return to Woodstock College next September for his fourth year of theology. Another year will be spent in Pershing before he is assigned as a missionary.

He hopes to return to the Philippines, where he taught for three years during his Regency as a member of the Society of Jesus.

## Doctor's Degree In Education For Coming Priest

Coming — The Rev. Joseph D. Donovan, assistant pastor at St. Patrick's Church, this city, was awarded the degree of Doctor of Education at the University of Buffalo during the past month. The thesis which was completed by Father Donovan to gain his degree was entitled "Certain Factors Affecting the Instigation of the Program of Institutes of Applied Arts and Sciences in New York State."

Father Donovan, who received his education for the priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, was ordained in May 1930.

While serving in the Patterson Diocese, Father Donovan did graduate work at Fordham University and merited his Master of Arts Degree at St. Bonaventure University in 1931.

BEFORE COMING to Corning, Father Donovan held assistant pastorates at St. Ann's Church, Hornell, and St. Margaret Mary's in Rochester. In addition to his parish work in Hornell, Father Donovan taught Philosophy at St. James Mercy Hospital, in Rochester he served on the board of the Library Association at Irondequoit and was chairman of the Board during his last year there.

Father Donovan is a member of the National Catholic Education Association and has been elected to membership in Phi Delta Kappa, national education association. At present he is serving on the Community Chest Board in Corning.

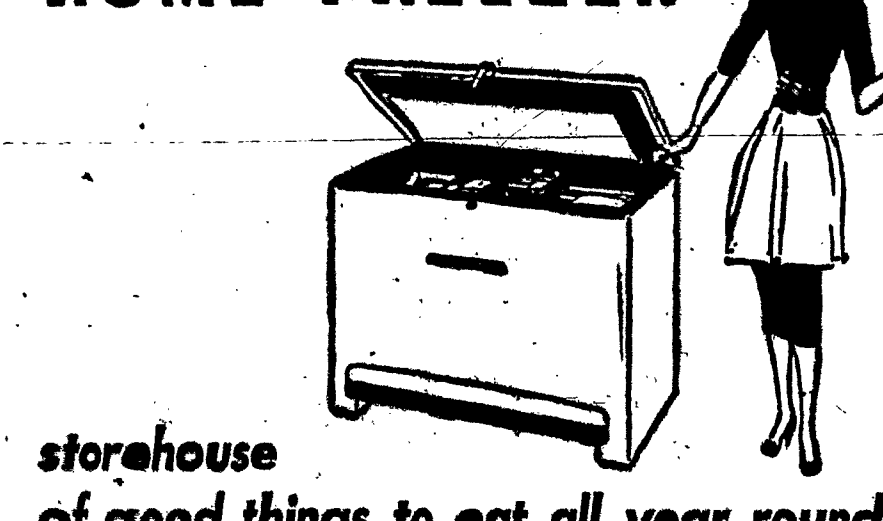
