CWV To Sponsor My Son John Film

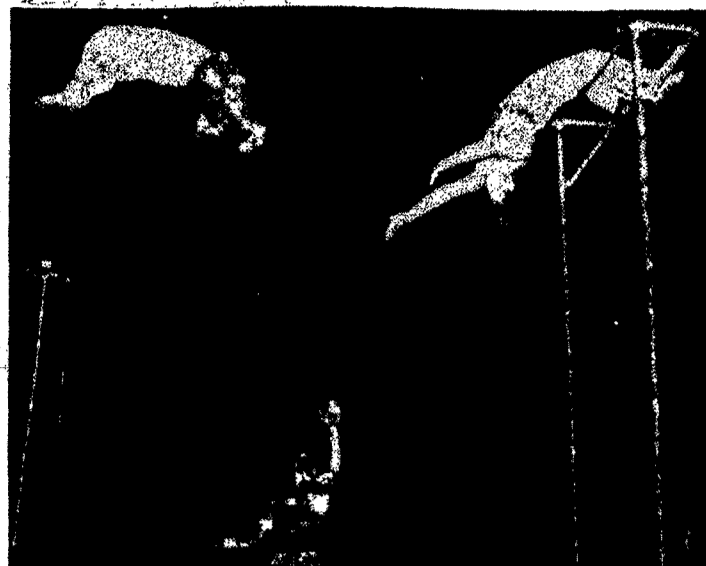
