

Grailville Girls Hear Fr. Ehmann Stress Laity's Role In Extending Mystical Body

Importance of the role of the laity in extending the Mystical Body throughout the world was stressed by the Rev. Benedict

Ehmann, pastor of St. Mary's of the Lake Church, Watkins Glen speaking at Grailville, Catholic community college for lay apostolic training at Loveland, Ohio. The spiritual unity of the world, Father Ehmann maintained, will not be achieved merely by arousing sympathetic ideals and establishing democratic principles. It will depend on our unity as Christians in the Mystical Body and on the realization of our mission — the mission of

His lecture at Grailville, on the doctrine of the Mystical Body as the basis for the conversion of the world was part of the course's general theme which emphasized the need for Catholics today to embrace the world, to have a "World view"—in their prayer, in their breath of interest, in their apostolic outlook.

Many of the girls who heard Father Ehmann will remain at Grailville for the six-weeks' seminars which will be held in various apostolic fields from July 8 to Aug. 16. In Art and Culture he stressed the principles of Christian dress designing, hand weaving, sculpture and ceramics, with special emphasis given to making of liturgical objects for Church and home.

Also in the apostolate of Music where summer students will receive a general foundation for musical leadership in the liturgical song of the Church, both plainchant and polyphony, as well as in the arts of folk song, dance and family music making.

ALSO IN FAMILY Service of offering opportunities to young women who want to dedicate themselves to the rebuilding of the Christian family. On the program is the Oriental student apostolate where students from many parts of Asia will meet to renew contact with their Oriental background and study the present crisis as it affects the East.

Also in the field of Lay Missions which will offer a program designed for those girls considering service as Lay apostles overseas as well as for others interested in learning more about the Church's world embracing missions. Closing the summer will be a week-long course from August 21 through August 27, "Opportunities in a Changing World," specifically planned to present the possibilities now open for young women in many fields of apostolic work in America and throughout the world.

Grailville prepares young women in all areas for the Church's Apostolate — a small number for a lifetime as dedicated Grail members, and others in their various capacities for some years of service. Grailville is at Loveland, Ohio.

Christ in the world—to establish His kingdom among men. Father Ehmann spoke to young women from more than 25 states and from several continents including South America, Australia, Asia and Europe, who attended the first course of the summer at Grailville, "The Lay Apostolate and a World View." Father Ehmann told the young women that the laity have the mission, given by Christ to all His Followers, to transmit their Christian Faith to others by living the Gospel in every phase of their daily lives.

Former editor of "The Choirmaster" and a recognized leader in the field of sacred music, Father Ehmann has encouraged the work of the Grail and of the lay apostolate in this country. He has been active in the liturgical movement for many years.
