### Famed Virgin Statue Due At Auriesville

The famed Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima will visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs at Auriesville on July 20. The famed statue which was blessed at the site of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal in 1917 has toured many dioceses of the United States and Canada.

It will be welcomed by pilgrims to the Auriesville Shrine at the 12 o'clock Mass. The priests and pilgrims to the Shrine will receive the Pilgrim Virgin Statue at the main entrance and escort it to the sanctuary of the Coliseum where it will rest during the Mass.

After Mass the Pilgrim procession will escort the Pilgrim Statue to the outdoor Martyrs Chapel where it will be enthroned for the veneration of the pilgrims until 2:30 p. m.

On the way to the Martyrs Chapel, the Pilgrim Virgin statue will be carried to the Katol Tokawitza Memorial where prayers will be offered for the early consecration of the Lily of the Mohawk, Katol Tokawitza.

At 3:30 p. m. the Pilgrim Virgin statue will accompany the Blessed Sacrament in solemn procession to the Ravine where are the remains of St. Rene Chapel.

### Judge Fenerty's Rites Conducted

Judge Clare Gerald Fenerty, 56, noted orator and Catholic layman who spoke in Rochester on two occasions died July 1, 1932, in Germantown Hospital.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered in the Church of the Holy Child, Philadelphia attended by church dignitaries and civil officials.

Judge Fenerty was a commencement speaker at Nazareth College when located on Augustin St. and was principal speaker at the St. John Fisher College campaign dinner in the Chamber of Commerce.

Active in veterans' organizations, the judge was an ardent foe of Communism. He was named Philadelphia's "Man of the Year" in June.

As a member of Congress he took the lead in the fight to stop religious persecution in Mexico.
