

THE PRELATE added that nearly every day Maryknoll has been receiving reports of the imprisonment or expulsion of members of its mission in South China. He expressed the belief that "there never has been so many martyrs in so many countries as there are now." Nevertheless, Bishop Lane pre-

licted the greatest resurgence of Christianity in history, as a result of the Reds' war on the hurch in Red China and Korea. Scores of Maryknollers have peen victims in these areas. Bishop Lane said.


