

## Career Woman All Right If She Mothers Something

New York -(NC) - Career women do not become hardened unless they neglect women's need of having to mother something.

This view was expressed by Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, Auxildirector of the National Society for the Propagation of the Faith, in an article on "The Role of Modern Woman" in Look magazine, published here.


"THROUGHOUT history women have engaged in economic and social careers without necessarily losing their feminity," Bishop Sheen wrote.
