

GOD LOVE YOU!

EVERYONE for himself is the law of Satan. "Bear ye one another's burdens" is the law of Christ. Those who have a deep faith are keenly sensitive to the fact that two-thirds of the population of the world go to bed hungry every night and that their average income is less than \$4 a week. . . There is only one man in all the world who feels the hunger of the world, and who burns with zeal for the conversion of every soul—that is the Holy Father. The rest of us have our sympathies localized. But with 100,000 missionaries knocking at his door, he turns to his faithful to fill his hands that he may empty them to lift the burdens of others.

How much do you suppose the Catholics of America contributed last year per head to the Holy Father for the spread of the Faith through the 618 missionary areas of the world? Would your guess be that they contributed more in a year than people bet at a horse race? Well, in the 4 tracks of New York State last year we 4,000,000 people bet \$73 per head. Would our sacrifices in 365 days equal that or would it be more? We speak not of what Catholics send directly to the Missions or to particular mission societies, but only of what was given directly to the Holy Father that he personally might distribute in His name as the Vicar of Christ. Here is the answer. The contribution of Catholics last year to the Holy Father's World Mission Society for the Propagation of the Faith was 15c per man, woman and child. That is not enough to buy a package of cigarettes. Most American children spend more than that each week on ice cream. . . Have we no ties in our souls for which we have to make reparation and penance? Are we not praying for a favor which might be won by sacrificing a day's wages for the Holy Father's Missions? . . . If we tell Our Lord in Holy Communion that we love Him, then we ought to prove it by helping save more souls in India, Africa and those other mission lands for whom we pray daily on the World Mission Society, which we send at your request and a \$1 offering. The rosary will be blessed by me.

The world is full of willing people,—some willing to help the Holy Father to aid the struggling church in pagan lands; the others willing to let them! . . . GOD LOVE YOU TO P. K. who sends \$10 and writes: "Several weeks ago I had asked for a new job where I am employed. While reading the 'God Love You' column one morning I pledged to send \$10 out of my first pay if I got the promotion. That afternoon I was notified that the job was mine. Many souls must have been praying for me." . . . GOD LOVE YOU TO Mrs. A.H. for her sacrifice of \$2 to the Holy Father's Missions. "I have given up cream and sugar in my coffee for a month. Though the taste may be bitter to me, I feel that this sacrifice may add a little sweetness in someone else's life." . . . GOD LOVE YOU TO E.A.H. who sold her Easter candy and sent the missions the \$5 she received from it. . . GOD LOVE YOU TO V.S. for \$3. "My roommate and myself decided to send this to the Holy Father's Missions rather than exchange graduation gifts."

If you had a private audience with the Holy Father would you say: "Your Holiness here is \$5 for your 1,100,000 pagans." Well! Chinese Urged To Play Role In Church Life

San Francisco — (NC) — Resolutions urging Chinese Catholics in this country to assume more responsible roles as members of the Church were adopted here at a two-day Pacific Regional Chinese Catholic Conference. Held at the Catholic Chinese Center, the sessions were attended by nearly 100 delegates representing Chinese Catholic communities up and down the Pacific coast as well as groups in areas as far away as Honolulu and Vancouver, B. C.

THE RESOLUTIONS called for the training of lay apostolate leaders from among Chinese students, workers and families. They urged also the full participation of Chinese Catholics in community civic, affairs education, recreation, health, housing and social service projects. In addition, the resolution appealed for the promotion of mutual understanding and cooperation between pastors and members of their congregations and "the application of the principles of observing, judging and acting upon, the immediate problems of the Chinese Catholic's environment."

RECOMMENDED by discussion leaders as specific undertakings by the Chinese Catholic apostolate were: the distribution of Catholic literature translated into Chinese, and the promotion of a Chinese-language advertising campaign patterned after the Knights of Columbus ads inviting inquiry into the Catholic Faith. "Many Chinese Catholics, and many non-Chinese," declared Ken Wong, a member of the conference committee, "do not know what the lay apostolate means. We hope that this gathering will help us to promote an enlightenment among our fellow Chinese."
