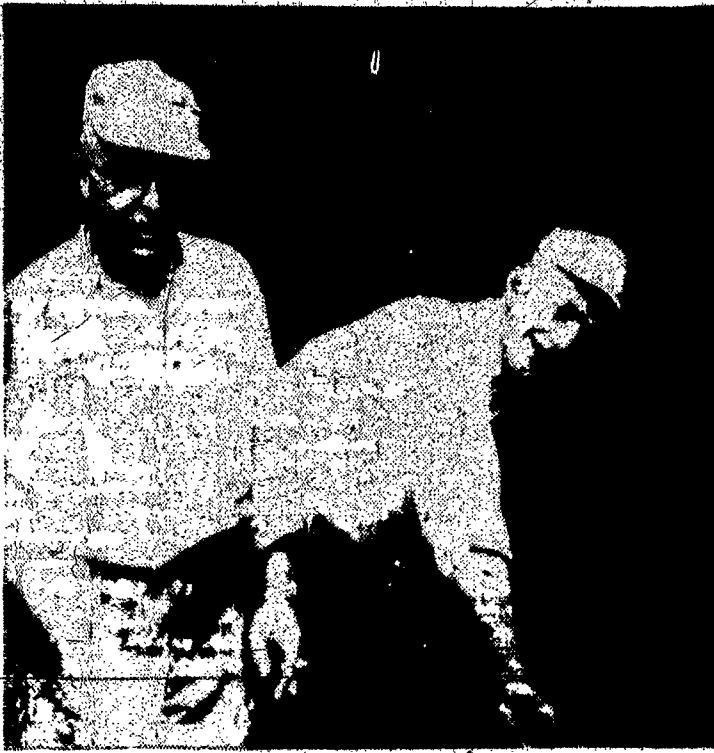


**FIXING UP NEW KC HOME**

**2 Rochester Nuns Given Maryknoll Assignments**

One Maryknoll Sister from Rochester will go to a Maryknoll convent on the Pacific Coast and another to the order's school in New York City, it was announced at Maryknoll Motherhouse, this week.

The two Sisters who have completed their mist on training at Maryknoll near Ossining, N. Y., are Sister Helen Mary (Helen Baumann) and Sister Francis Michel (Janet Ann Rose).

They were among a group of about 45 Maryknoll Sisters bidden "Godspeed" at a Mission Departure Ceremony held at the Maryknoll Motherhouse, Sunday, July 20.

Auxiliary Bishop David F. Cunningham of Syracuse was principal speaker. Bishop Raymond A. Lanza, Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers, presided.

Invited with the mission groups, the 45 young Sisters will go to Maryknoll Sisters' mission posts in Asia, Africa, Latin American and many Pacific Islands, as well as to missions in this country.

SISTER HELEN MARY, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George A. Baumann, 316 Lake View Park, Rochester, is a member of Holy Rosary Parish. She was graduated from Holy Rosary School, Nazareth Academy and Nazareth College and received her M.A. in Social Service Work from Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

A NIECE of the Rev. William M. Carman, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Corning, Sister Helen Mary has two sisters, Mrs. James F. Gardner, 1672 Chili Ave. and Bernard Lavery, Country Club Road, York, Pa. She has been assigned to one of the Maryknoll Convents on the Pacific Coast.

SISTER FRANCIS MICHEL, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Francis J. Ross, 195 Wilttingham Road after graduating from Blessed Sacrament School and Our Lady of Mercy High School in Rochester, took the course in Maryknoll Teachers' College.

She will teach at the Maryknoll Sisters' School, St. Anthony's in the Bronx, N. Y.

**Graduate Study Interest High At Nazareth**

Lively interest in European affairs is indicated at Nazareth College by the registration in Dr. William Gwynn's course in United States Foreign Policy, it was announced by the Division of Graduate Studies at the college, this week.

The Graduate Studies is now in its third summer at the Women's College conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph.

In Moral and Spiritual Foundations of Education, the summer course graduate students of the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lintz are examining contemporary theories in the light of Christian principles.

Miss Margaret Kenney, Principal of Lake View School No. 7, is teaching a course in Contemporary Trends in the Elementary School, designed to be of help to those who work with boys and girls in the grades.

THE DISCUSSIONS are centered on the evaluation of the total school program in relation to what research has shown about the integrated development of children. Current literature, audio-visual materials and classroom practices are being examined.

Students in this group bring a breadth of experience, with teachers from kindergarten through eighth grade, principals and music specialists participating. The needs listed by the group center about child development as affecting total behavior, reading and its place in the program, parent and community relationships, the place of supervision and inservice growth of teachers.

For Chaucer students an extensive library exhibit has facilitated acquaintance with a number of unusual books, many of them out of print. Pictorial maps, reproductions of English scenes, and a large replica of mine host's Tabard Inn make the exhibit of interest to all.

THE OLD ENGLISH course is showing its students England's part in the "one world" of older days, and the role of Celtic and Benedictine monasticism in the first flowering of our literature.

Motion pictures of the scenes and antiquities of England, Scotland, and Wales and the use of facsimiles of ancient manuscripts point up and lighten the summer program.
