## Indian Lad Counts Collection As He Takes It Up

Although one fourth of the American Indians are Catholics, few have been graced by the divine call to a religious life. One of two Indians who entered Santa Fe's Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary last September is Francis Louis Olguin.

This summer Francis, whose Indian name is Little Pine Tree, is earning money for accessories at the Seminary by working in the Marquette League's New York office. He accompanies the Rev. Bernard A. Cullen, director general of the League, on lecture dates to pass the collection basket. The priest, who is most favorably impressed with the Indian lad, says one indication that he will become a good pastor is Francis' interest in the collection. He knows to the last cent the total amount before the counting—he adds it up as each person drops his contribution into the basket. No sponsor for Francis' education has been found as yet—the cost is \$450 a year or \$45 a month. "Why not," asks Father Cullen, "be a godfather (or god mother) to this most worthy and lovable aspirant to the Holy Priesthood?"

## St. Christopher Library Lists Books For Summer

Copies of many new books, now the subject of wide discussion in lay circles, are now available at St. Christopher's Library, located in the Catholic Daughters Rooms at E. Church and State Streets, Elmira. It was announced at the library today.

In the great variety of new books the following are particularly sought. For light reading these novels are suggested: *The Stranger* by Malachi Carroll, the story of an unfrocked priest; *The Perfect Joy of St. Francis* by Felix Timmermans, a delightful picture of St. Francis of Assisi; *The Betrothed* by Alessandro Manzoni, the tale of 17th century Milan.

**THE PROGRESS** of the fight of Communism versus Christianity in America, China, and Europe is graphically related in three new books: *The Cry Is Peace* by Louis F. Budenz, a former key Communist; *The Enemy Within* by Rev. Raymond Gallagher, a Jesuit missionary in China from 1930-1949; *Faith Is A Weapon* by Thomas B. Morgan, a Rome correspondent of the United Press.

The history of the Church in America is the subject of two fascinating books: *Giant In The Wilderness* by Helene Marguerite, relates the missionary work of Father Charles Neuvic among the early pioneers in the middle west and Canada; *The Wilderness* by J. Herman Schaeffer recounts the experience of Benedict Joseph Flaget, the first Bishop of the territory extending west of the Allegheny Mountains from Tennessee to Michigan.

The Catholic viewpoint of modern literature is presented in three books: *Fifty Years Of The American Novel, 1900-1950*, edited by Father Harold C. Gardner answers the question, "What is the Catholic Estimate of the modern novel?"

Maria Cross by Donat O'Donnell is the Irish critic's estimate of popular Catholic writers such as Francis Mauriac, Graham Greene, Paul Claudel, Evelyn Waugh.

*The Voice of the Irish* by Blanche Mary Kelly has a two-fold purpose according to the author: "of assembling essential facts of Irish literary history in order to present characteristic qualities of Irish literature and of showing in its proper relief and perspective — the so-called Irish renaissance."

The informed Catholic seeks knowledge of the position of the Church in the modern world with its philosophy of materialism, Catholicism and the World. Today by Aelred Graham. *The Salvation of the Nations* by Jean Danielou, and Catholicism and American Freedom by James M. O'Neill have been made available at all St. Christopher's Library.

Biographies of the saints of the past and the converts of the present are informative and inspirational. Many shelves containing the old favorites and new publications invite readers at St. Christopher's Library.

Among the books of inspirational reading are found *The World's First Love*, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen's new book about Mary, "The Woman of the World," *Joseph and Jesus* by Francis L. Elliot, S.J., and *Are One by Leo J. Toole*.

The library is open Wednesday 10:30 to 5 and Saturday 3 to 5 and welcomes all to use its facilities.

## Graduate Study Interest High At Nazareth

Lively interest in European affairs is indicated at Nazareth College by the registration in Dr. William Gwinn's course in United States Foreign Policy, it was announced by the Division of Graduate Studies at the college, this week.

The Graduate Studies is now in its third summer at the Women's College conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph.

In Moral and Spiritual Foundations of Education, the summer course graduate students of the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lintz are examining contemporary theories in the light of Christian principles.

Miss Margaret Kenney, Principal of Lake View School No. 7, is teaching a course in Contemporary Trends in the Elementary School, designed to be of help to those who work with boys and girls in the grades.

**THE DISCUSSIONS** are centered on the evaluation of the total school program in relation to what research has shown about the integrated development of children. Current literature, audio-visual materials and classroom practices are being examined.

Students in this group bring a breadth of experience, with though eighth grade principals and music specialists participating. The needs listed by the group center about child development as affecting total behavior, reading and its place in the program, parent and community relationships, the place of supervision and in-service growth of teachers.

For Chaucer students an extensive library exhibit has facilitated acquaintance with a number of unusual books, many of them out of print. Pictorial maps, reproductions of English scenes, and a large replica of mine host Tabard Inn make the exhibit of interest to all.

**OLD ENGLISH** course is showing its students England's part in the "one world" of olden days, and the role of Celtic and Benedictine monasticism in the first flowering of our literature. Motion pictures of the scenes and antiquities of England, Scotland, Wales and the use of facsimiles of ancient manuscripts point up and lighten the summer program.

Reservations are being made by James E. Marcell, chairman, Glenwood 2167-W after 6 p. m. until July 23.

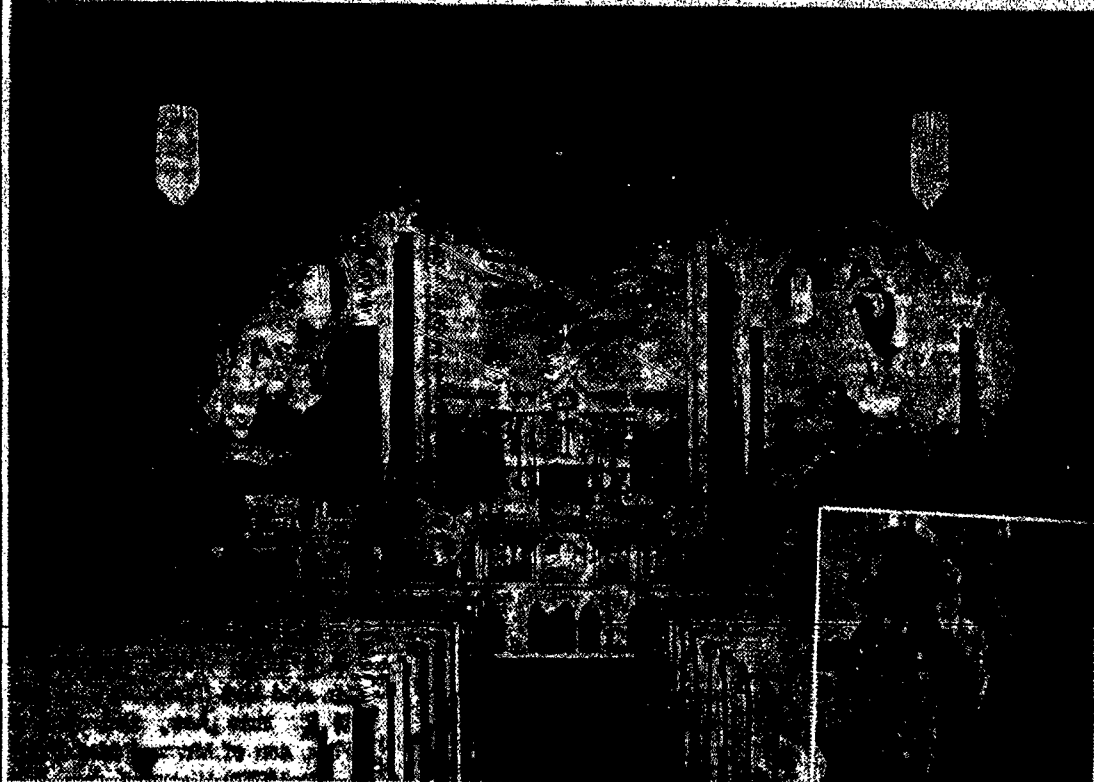
**Summer School Held For 54 At Clifton**

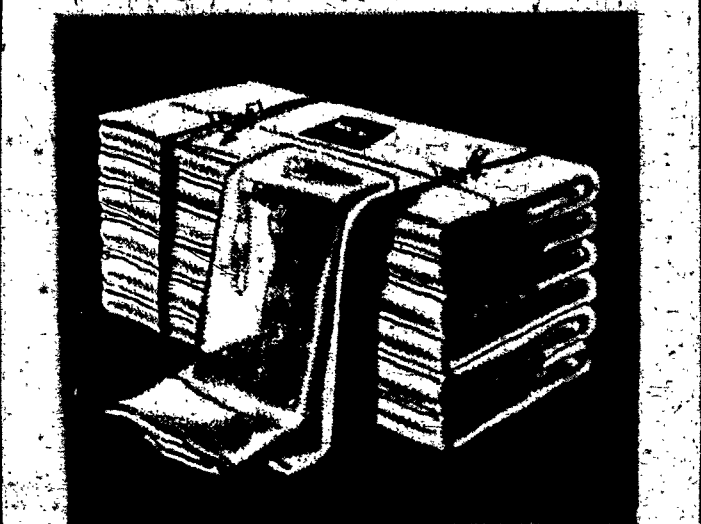
## Scranton Trip Set For Watkins Group
