GOD LOVE YOU!

A CATHOLIC girl aged 9, was seized by the Communists in China and told to lead a procession of the other Catholic girls in the Missions to the latrine. There she was told to drop therein her medal of the Blessed Mother. Upon refusing, the Communists seized her father, brought both of them to the Communism hall of the Church where they were threatened with death. This falling, they took the girl to a public platform, made her kneel and as she clutched the medal of the Blessed Mother in her hand, hundreds of pagan children were ordered by the Communists to file in procession before her to spit in her face.

The hatred of the Chinese Communists against the Blessed Mother cannot be explained except by the Devil who is the invisible force of the mystical body of the anti-Christ. A recent letter from Shanghai tells us that the Communists believe that Mary is a clever woman hiding somewhere in China. "Who is this Mary?" the Communists asked at a recent trial of Chinese members of the Legion of Mary. On answering: "She is the Mother of Jesus." The Communist judges answered, "No! She is somewhere in Shanghai where she is directing you; we shall not rest until we lay a hand on her."

Mother of Sorrows School Campaign Tops \$100,000

With more than the \$100,000 sought already pledged, the one-day drive toward erection of a new school in Our Mother of Sorrows Parish, Greece was entirely "successful," according to the Rev. Daniel B. O'Rourke, pastor.

An average family contribution of \$312 was made with no family donating less than \$200, the pastor reported.

THE CAMPAIGN was conducted by workers under Chairman Leo T. Sawyko and Robert B. Wegman on Sunday, Aug. 17, between the hours of 1 and 4 p. m.

On that "beautiful Sunday," more than two-thirds of the families were home to receive campaign workers and make their pledges, Father O'Rourke said.

Approximately \$200,000 will be the cost of constructing the new school building on Latta Road, plans for which are in the hands of the architect.

The new school, made necessary by the population growth in the parish, is planned for approximately 600 pupils with a modern kindergarten, an audio-visual room, quarters for a school nurse and other modern requirements.

National Student Congress To Draw 3 Area Delegates

Students of Rochester diocese will participate in the Ninth National Congress of the National Federation of Catholic College Students scheduled at Notre Dame University, South Bend, Ind. from Aug. 28 to Sept. 3.

Delegates from Nazareth College planning to attend are Leona Melsenzahl, regional vice president; and Margaret McGrath, senior delegate from Nazareth College. Another Rochesterian, Robert McVeigh of Niagara University and regional NFCCS president will attend.

"The Meaning of Education in the Modern World," will be the seven-day convention theme. Prominent speakers will be heard at the first nine plenary sessions and the final meetings of the various NFCCS Commissions. National Council and various committee meetings, twin sessions for each of the 14 national commissions and an informal dance are scheduled.

THE CONGRESS will officially convene with opening ceremonies of the first plenary session on Thursday, Aug. 28 at 7 p. m. A reception will be held the first evening.

Two plenary sessions Friday will be followed in the evening by the first commission panels. The commissions have been divided into four groups of three or four commissions each, in group A—Catholic Action Study, Forensics, Family Life, and Missions; and group B—Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Press, and Industrial Relations will convene Friday night.

ALL OF SATURDAY will be devoted to commission work. Group B and Group C—Liturgy, International Relations, and International Justice will open the day with group D—Marology, Student Government, and Social Service sharing the afternoon with group C. Groups D and A will conclude commission panels Saturday evening.

After various committee meetings Sunday morning, the Congress outing will begin in the early afternoon.

The Religious Affairs Vice-Presidents' plenary is scheduled for Monday morning, with commission meetings that afternoon.

Six more plenaries will wind up the Congress, with an informal dance set for Tuesday night after election of officers, and adjournment on Wednesday afternoon.

Each day of the congress will begin with Mass at 7:30 and 8:30 a.m. in the hall chapel, followed by breakfast in the University Dining Hall and then the business of the day at 9:45 a.m. Rosary and compline, lunch and dinner separate the three daily sessions. All meetings will end by 10:00 p.m. daily.

This is the second year that the annual convention will be held during the summer on a college campus. Over 750 students, and moderators from more than 180 Catholic colleges throughout the nation are expected.

Nazareth Delegates Going To Pax Romana Congress

Among delegates representing 86 national student federations and some 46 graduate associations from 50 countries who will attend the 22nd World Congress of Pax Romana in Canada, this summer, are two representing Nazareth College.

Representing the Sisters of St. Joseph College for women will be Kathryn Curran, student government president and Eileen Flanagan, NFCCS Junior delegate.

In all, 125 persons from Europe and 75 from South America are expected to attend, in addition to several hundred North American students. Exiled federations from Iron-Curtain countries will also be represented.

PRECEDED BY pre-Congress business meetings in Toronto, the Pax Romana Congress will officially open Aug. 26 in Montreal. During this six-day session, a well-known speaker will address commission sessions and evenings of cultural and social entertainment. On Aug. 30 there will be an outing in the Laurentian mountains.

From Montreal the Congress will move on to Quebec for the two final days. The last two guest speakers will talk on the remaining aspects of the study theme: "The Role of the University."

The Pax Romana Congress will be the meeting ground for a supra-national exchange of thought, and fraternal understanding and charity.

Only once before since its creation in 1921 has Pax met on the North American continent—in Washington, D. C., in 1939.
