subservient to it, American officials were advised. To do this, all ties between local churches and ecclesiastical authorities abroad are severed so far as possible, with communication censored and visits prohibited. Leading members of the clergy who stand out against this pressure are gradually liquidated and their places taken by weaker and more tractable men appointed by the State.

The main drive is directed against the religious education of youth. Church instruction and incessant anti-religious propaganda introduced into all schools and youth organizations.

Where the Church can be rendered impotent, as in the case with the Russian Orthodox Church in the Soviet Union, the report states, the more brutal forms of persecutions are dropped, but the pressure against the churches never relaxes.

One of the most clever and devastating propaganda lines being used against the Roman Catholic Church in satellite areas is that conducted in Poland against the Vatican because of its refusal to recognize the new German-Polish boundary along the Oder and Neisse rivers, the report says.

IN POLAND the Communist authorities pretend to think the Church pro-German, while in Germany an opposite line is taken. The propaganda drive, incessant since 1946, is designed to cause the establishment of a "national" Catholic Church in Poland but this has not proved possible, the report declares, because of the heroism of the Polish hierarchy which has steadfastly resisted Communist pressure.

The Communists of Poland now aim to make the Catholic clergy more dependent on the State for economic support and thus bring them to submission by forcing a series of gradual concessions.

In Hungary, where 70 per cent of the people are of the Catholic faith, persecution of the Church has been more severe, the report points out, with the Hungarian Bench of Bishops debarred by arrests and imprisonments, following the jailing of Josef Cardinal Mindszenty.

THE CHURCH has been dispossessed of its lands and schools and all communication with the West is being severed.

The persecution of Catholics has been ruthless, with the Church forced into almost complete subservience, the report notes. The Uniate, or Greek Catholic Church has been forcibly separated from the Catholic Church and all six of its bishops arrested.

The Catholic Church in Albania has suffered the greatest persecution and all leading members of the clergy executed or imprisoned. The Church has been "nationalized" with all ties to the Vatican broken. Only three churches are open—intermittently—in Tirana, the capital. Nuns are forbidden to wear habits and have been ordered to agricultural labor and all Catholic schools are closed.

High School, diocesan officials pointed out.

THE HIGH School-Jubilee Fund will allocate \$1,500,000 for building of the boys' school under the provision that the Jesuits will thereafter assume additional costs and indebtedness. The remainder of the total of \$1,795,500 that will be disbursed in Rochester will subsidize the building of the new girls' high school by the Sisters of St. Joseph. Other major projects to be supported by the overall fund, with Bishop Kearney himself serving as treasurer, will be the construction of new Catholic central high schools in both Elmira and Auburn.

THE ESTABLISHMENT of the fund and the campaign to develop it have been conceived as a two-fold tribute from the diocese to Bishop Kearney. The general canvass will open on Oct. 28, the 20th anniversary of the bishop's consecration, and will close on Nov. 11, which will be the 15th anniversary of his installation as Bishop of Rochester.

Formation of the special gifts committee, which will be headed by Frederick M. Tobin, president of the Tobin Packing Company, and the regular campaign corps is now going forward under the direction of Robert E. Ginna, general campaign chairman and executive vicepresident of the Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, vicar general of the diocese, will serve as honorary chairman of the fund drive.
