### Union Men Erect Shrine In Honor Of Monsignor Boland

Bishop Joseph A. Burke of Buffalo dedicated a shrine in Buffalo honoring Msgr. John P. Boland, veteran labor affairs authority who was chairman of the New York State Labor Relations Board from 1937-42 and is widely known in Rochester Diocese.

IN LIFESIZE figures the shrine depicts St. Joseph and the Christ child at a carpenter's bench. An inscription reads: "Every man by doing is duty is following Him, Who, being God, chose to become a carpenter and to be known as the son of a carpenter."

Buffalo Federation of Labor craftsmen erected the shrine. It represents completion of the first project of the Father Boland Foundation, which is supported by area union men.

The foundation was founded three years ago to carry on the name and work of the veteran labor mediator. Future projects include scholarships, an agency to prevent and solve labor disputes, and an education program to eliminate causes of labor troubles.

Monsignor Boland said the shrine should not be considered a memorial, but should serve as a street-corner reminder of the spiritual strength locked in every act of collective bargaining between labor and management.

THE SHRINE is next to Monsignor Boland's rectory at St. Thomas Aquinas Church. He left a sick bed at Mercy Hospital to celebrate the 10th annual Labor Day Mass at the church, attended by 1,500 persons, and to participate in the dedication.

Monsignor Boland has served as a member of the State Mediation Board since 1948.

In blessing the shrine, Bishop Burke said members of both management and labor have enthusiastically donated it "to one whom they recognize as an outstanding champion of social justice."

Sculptor of the limestone shrine was Hugues Maurin, native of France who served in the French underground during World War II and was wounded.

### Bishop Presents 300 Area Pilgrims Expected To Make Auriesville Trip

Lafayette, Ind. - His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester who served as Episcopal Moderator of the Newman Club Federation for 12 years has relinquished his post and a new moderator will be named in the national convention at Purdue University, here.

Bishop Kearney at the convention presented the third annual Cardinal Newman Award to Marvin E. Coyle of Pacific Falls, Calif., retired vice president of General Motors Corp.

Some 610 delegates and 65 chaplains from secular colleges and universities of the nation attended the four-day session.

Observers at the sessions included Dr. Grace Carlson, 1948 vice presidential candidate on the Socialist Workers (Trotskyite) Party ticket, who returned to the Catholic Church last winter; Pierre Francois, head of the youth secretariat of Unesco and Thomas G. J. Kersteing of the University of Utrecht, lay leader of the Union of Catholic Students in The Netherlands.

Archbishop Rummel New Orleans (NC) - Archbishop Joseph F. Rummel of New Orleans will formally observe the golden jubilee of his ordination October 5 to 7.

Close to 300 persons are expected to make the Knights of Columbus pilgrimage to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs at Auriesville, Sunday, Sept. 14, it was announced at the Rochester Council headquarters, this week.

The pilgrimage sponsored by New York State Council, Knights of Columbus will attract pilgrims from all sections of the State. Sermon at the Mass Sunday will be delivered by His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester, former state chaplain of the K. of C.

Rochester pilgrims will leave the New York Central station at 7 a.m. in charge of Charles A. Tucker, faithful navigator of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, K. of C. and pilgrimage chairman.

HEADING THE local group will be Grand Knight George F. Vick, Jr. Other Councils will be led by their grand knights or other officers. A large delegation is reported going from Buffalo.

The shrine at Auriesville is the oldest religious shrine in the state and is on the site of the martyrdom of America's first canonized saints.

More than 100,000 persons go from various sections of the United States and Canada to visit the shrine annually. The Novington,

area of 625 acres is dedicated to Saints Isaac Jogues, Rene Goupil and John LaLande. There the French Jesuits gave their lives while engaged in missionary work during the early 17th century.
