The men were excused from their military duties for the occasion under the Army's policy of encouraging its soldiers to participate in religious services. They made the trip from Berlin to Stuttgart by train and the remainder of the journey by bus.

## Bishop Walsh Observes Jubilee At Vatican City

Bishop Emmet M. Walsh, Coadjutor of Youngstown, on Sept. 8 observed the silver jubilee of his episcopal consecration while on a visit to Rome, his first since 1934. The Bishop, an alumnus of St. Bernard's Seminary, class of 1916, has visited Rochester on many occasions.

The Jubilee was marked by a congratulatory message from His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, in which the Holy Father bestowed his blessing on the Bishop.

Bp. Walsh His Excellency offered Mass at the altar of the tomb of St. Peter in the crypt of the Vatican Basilica on the anniversary. He was assisted by his traveling companion, Msgr. George Lewis Smith of Alken, S. C., and Msgr. Joseph R. Lacy of the North American College in Rome.

Sisters of two congregations represented in the Youngstown and Charleston diocese, which Bishop Walsh headed from 1927 to 1949, also attended the Mass; Oblate Sisters of Sacred Heart who have a house at McDonald, a suburb of Youngstown, and Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis who operate St. Francis Hospital in Greenville, S. C.

Later, the Jubilarian was guest of honor at a dinner given by Bishop Martin J. O'Connor, rector of the North American College. Bishop Walsh is Episcopal Chairman of the Legal Department Welfare Conference.
